Y.; a brother, William S. Benner of Salem; two sisters, Mrs. Amelia Hollis of Eugene and Mrs. Lou Smith of Gladstone, and by five grandchildren.

Vegetables, fruits, nuts. Arrangements—over 15 inches, under 15 inches, Halloween table, foliage, berried shrub, colonial nosegays, corsages, garden club displays.

Colonel Foster Appointed to Defense Post

Last of nine deputies for Marion county's civilian defense organization was announced Thursday by Col. Mark Hillary, director. Eugene I. Foster, retired national guard colonel and now field auditor for the state treasurer, will be deputy for liaison with the armed forces, the state and other county agencies.

All key personnel of the organization, deputies and members of the coordinating council, as well as community directors, will be sworn in by the County Judge Grant Murphy at 3 p.m. Friday, November 3.

Following the ceremony, the group will discuss forthcoming action on the initial draft of the master defense plan for the county. Colonel Foster, a field artillery officer, saw active duty in World Wars I and II. In the latter war his assignments included post commands at Camp Adair, near Corvallis, and Camp McQuaide, Calif.
