

Grains Rush Higher During Wild Trading

CHICAGO, Nov. 6 (AP)—Grains rushed upward on the board of trade today in an active and sometimes slightly wild trade. Heavy buying followed official recognition of reports which have helped to sustain prices for about three weeks—that Chinese Communist troops had joined with their ideological brothers in fighting United Nations forces in Korea.

All grains did not hold onto their best gains. There was plenty of selling toward the close, much of it coming from local traders who wanted to be out of the market over the election day holiday tomorrow. That clipped sizable chunks off the advance in all but soybeans.

Wheat ended 1/2 to 4 cents higher, corn 3/4-1/2 higher, oats 2/4-1/2 higher, rye 3/4-1/2 higher, soybeans 10 cents higher and hard to 92 cents a hundred pound higher.

These gains were certainly substantial, but they were a good deal less than those recorded at and shortly after the opening, when buying orders poured into the pits from commission houses. At one time wheat was up as much as 6 1/2, corn 7 1/2, oats 6 cents (the daily limit) and rye 8 cents.

The upward surge sent all corn, oats and soybean deliveries to new seasonal highs. Also at new peaks were July wheat, May and July rye, and March and May hard.

Since the close on Saturday, Oct. 14, at the time the Chinese Communist reports first started circulating, wheat has gained 7 1/2 to 12 1/2 cents, corn 16 1/2 to 18 1/2 cents, oats 10 1/2 to 11 1/2 cents, rye 13 1/2 to 15 1/2 cents, soybeans 56 1/2 to 58 cents and hard \$2.95 to \$3.87 a hundred pounds.

Threat of War Tends to Drop Stock Prices

NEW YORK, Nov. 6 (AP)—Stock and commodity markets shuddered today under the impact of a new war threat. Stock prices went into a high-speed decline. Major commodities for future delivery surged ahead.

A last-minute flurry of demand in the stock exchange gave prices a small boost from their extreme lows and profit-taking cut into the largest gains among commodities.

Traders went to work after reading headlines quoting General MacArthur that Communist forces had intervened in the Korean war. Just as the stock exchange opened trading for the day a formal charge by MacArthur that Chinese Communists are fighting U. N. forces in Korea was delivered to the United Nations.

A wave of selling promptly rolled over the market. Quotations sank \$1.60 to \$5 a share before pressure let up. In the first hour of business, though, nearly \$2,000,000 worth was wiped off the market value of all stocks listed on the exchange.

For 40 minutes or so the ticker tape was unable to keep up its usual speedy report of prices. The lag amounted to five minutes at the worst and the exchange reported to the unusual procedure.
