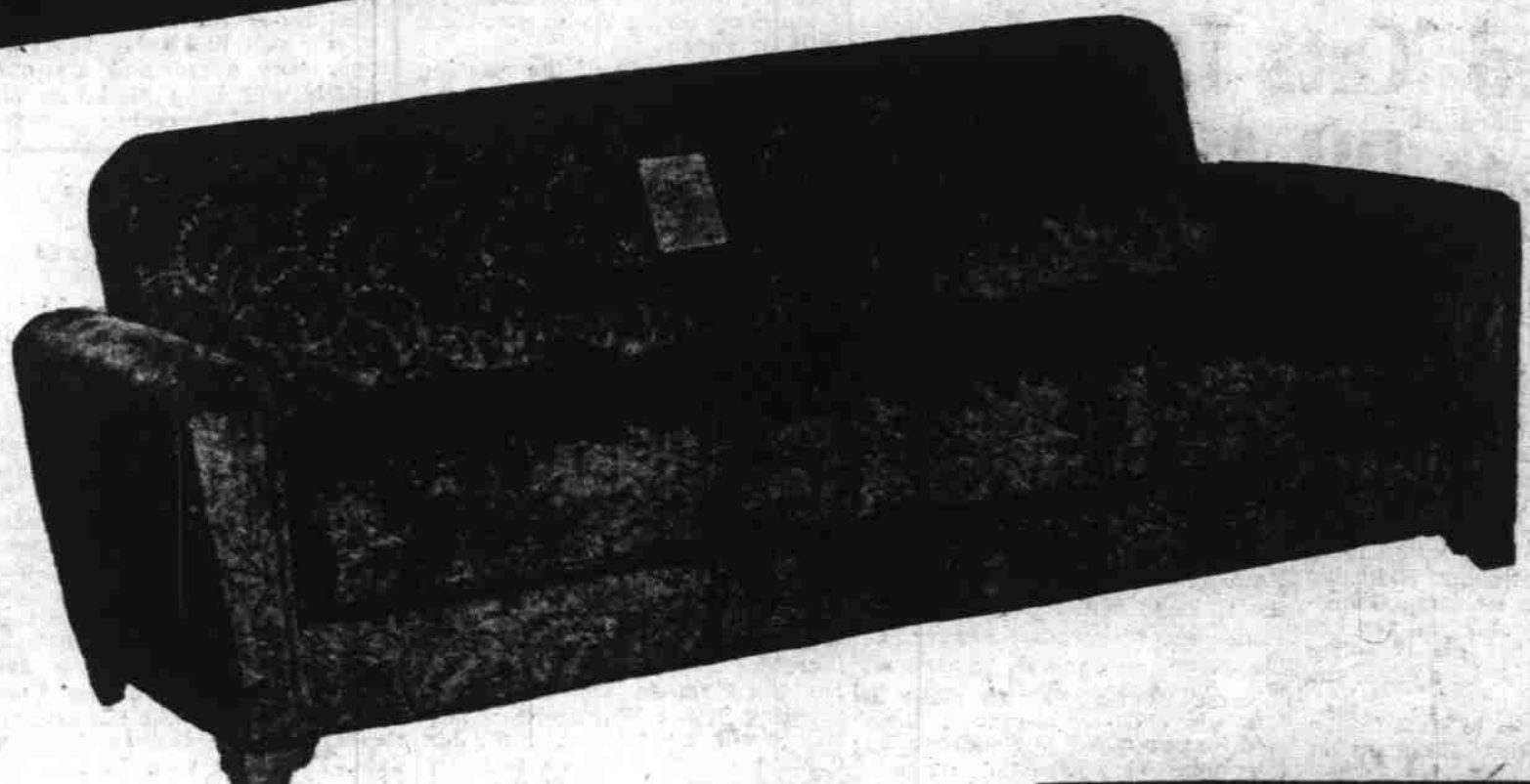
December 16 was chosen for the Christmas party to be held at the Four Corners Community hall for

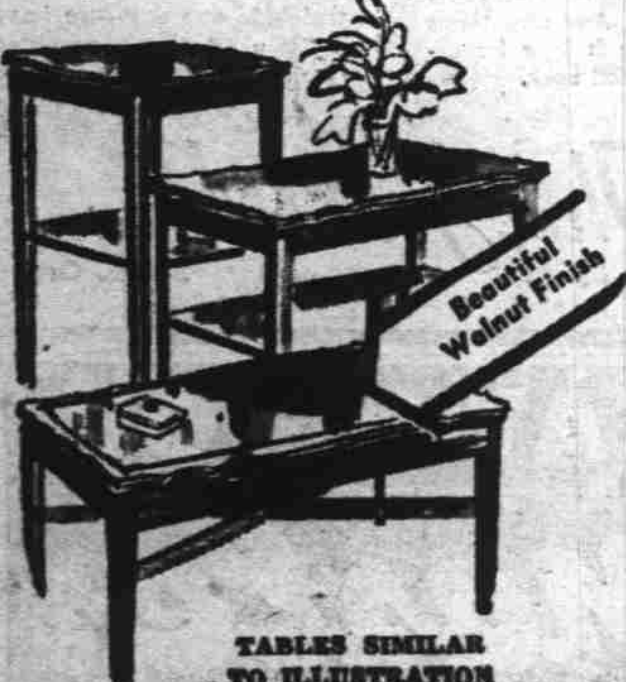
