

Reception and Exhibit on Friday

On Friday night's social agenda is the reception and exhibition of "Reproductions of Great Masters" at the Elstrom Galleries between 7 and 9 o'clock. The Salem Art association is sponsoring the reception and exhibit, which is arranged and loaned by the Portland Art Museum.

The ten reproductions are large and colorful, representing the original paintings with such fidelity that they enable the observer to gain a real understanding and enjoyment of the artists' work. Included are the following: Portrait of Dick Tybis, 1533, by Hans Holbein; Madonna Adoring, 1455-57, by Fra Filippo Lippi; Whitehall, c. 1746, by Canaletto; View of Toledo, 1604-14, by El Greco; The Infanta Margarita Teresa in Red, 1664, by Del Mazo; The Bullfight, c. 1810, by Francisco de Goya; Summer, The Harvest, 1565, by Pieter Breughel the Elder; Young Girl at an Open Half Door, 1645, by Rembrandt; Young Woman With a Water Jug, undated, by Johannes Vermeer; and Mrs. Freake and Baby Mary, 1670, by unknown artist.

The exhibit will open in the gallery Monday and remain for two weeks. Guest speaker at the reception and showing will be Cameron Paulin of the Willamette university art department.
