2-Favoring strong soil conservation practices.

3-Favoring a trial period of the Brannan or some similar plan. 4-Favoring a 100 per cent price control or no control.

1-Objected to cities collecting meter fees and a portion of the state gas tax. Cities with meters turn over gas tax to the county rural road fund. (The farmers object to paying two maintenance taxes: one on their gas for road funds and one to help towns keep up their

2-Object to any money being spent for any state buildings such as highway or office buildings at the present, at least it be held at

3—Favoring gas tax refund to be continued. 4-Favoring visiting between locals be revived.
