Three talks in the Salem area by a missionary just returned from Korea are slated for this week end. He is the Rev. Elmer Kilbourne, who with his wife served for several years under the Oriental Missionary society.

Kilbourne, who was evacuated with his family from Seoul last summer, will speak tonight at the Dallas Youth for Christ rally, Sunday at 3 p.m. at First Baptist church and Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at Four Corners Baptist church.

The rally program at Dallas, at 7:30 p.m., will include musical numbers by several young people, according to Gary Risher, director. He noted that Kilbourne set up the Korean visit itinerary for Bob Pierce, Bob Finley and Gil Dadds on an evangelistic tour.

At the Salem church he will tell "The Plight of the Korean Christians" and the work done by missions among the more than 1,000,000 Christians in that country, followed by destruction and persecution now.

At the evening service Dr. Lloyd T. Anderson, pastor, will continue his series of messages on Russia.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 — All missionaries of the American Baptist Foreign Mission society in China have been sent cables by their home office suggesting they withdraw from stations as soon as possible, according to Dr. Jesse R. Wilson, home secretary.

Increased tension in the field and recent communist orders making transmittal of funds practically impossible would be cited as the reasons. Wilson said normal business Christian leaders who will carry on the work.

About half of the 48 Baptist missionaries active in China in 1949 have withdrawn. Wilson said one of their chief duties had been to train native Christian leaders.
