Violinist Renardy to Play Here

First concert in Salem for the new year will be that of Ossy Renardy, internationally known violinist, who comes on the Community concert series Thursday, January 18, to Salem high school. Admission is by membership ticket only.

Born in Vienna, Ossy Renardy's talents were discovered when he was only five, and when he came to the United States in 1937, his fame was already established in Europe. During the war he served in the U.S. army for four years and played some 400 concerts for GIs besides concerts for the Red Cross and in the interest of War Bonds.

He has appeared as soloist with the symphonies of Boston, Chicago, Amsterdam, Houston, Rochester and with the New York Philharmonic-symphony. The past two summers Renardy has toured the Scandinavian countries.

Renardy is the owner of one of the most fabulous of violins, the

"Cannon Joseph" by Guarneri de Gesu made in 1743. It is said to have belonged to Paganini and is valued at over \$50,000.

He will play the music of Handel, Mozart, Paganini, Schubert, Dvorak, Kreisler and Chaminade.
