Name Clearance **Duty With Clerks**

The real estate commissioner has no authority to refuse to renew the license of either of two collection agencies operating in Portland because of the similarity of names, Attorney General Geo-rge Neuner held Friday.

One is the U.S. Protective service and the other the United States Protective service.

Neuner said the only administrative officer, other than the courts, empowered to make a determination as to whether an assumed name resembles a previous one so closely as to cause confusion, is the county clerk.
