Dobbs to Play Piano On Monday

WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY—Ralph Dobbs, distinguished pianist and head of the piano department at Willamette university, will be presented in his first concert of the year Monday, March 12, in Waller hall auditorium at 8:15 p. m.

Dobbs' musical education commenced when he was only four years old, under the guidance of his father. His pianistic progress continued under his parent's tutelage until he began study with Alexander Raab with whom he worked exclusively.

Dobbs' work came to the attention of pianist-composer Percy Grainger who selected him to appear as soloist in the Hollywood Bowl "Symphonies Under the Stars."

In 1931 Mr. Dobbs was honored as winner of the Frederick Stock award which gave him the opportunity to appear as soloist with the Chicago Symphony orchestra. Eugene Stinson, music critic of the Chicago Daily News, wrote, "Pianistically he is the most dynamic and capable young artist Chicago has produced."

Since his appointment at Willamette College of Music in 1949, Dobbs has played numerous concerts throughout the northwest.
