SALEM HEIGHTS, April 20 - Formal organization of Good Shepherd Lutheran church will take place Sunday at 3 p.m. in St. Mark Lutheran church in Salem. Special speaker will be the Rev. Walter J. Knutson, Portland, president of the southern conference of the Pacific synod.

Liturgists will be the Rev. Warren Pechman of Emmanuel Lutheran church, Willamina, and the Rev. George Holmquist of Faith Lutheran, Keizer. The declaration of organization will be read by the Rev. Homer W. Berner, mission developer for the board of American missions of the United Lutheran church.

The new church will organize with 85 confirmed members and a total of 136 baptized members. Officers are Marion Miller, vice president of the council; Arthur H. Corrigan, secretary; George Martin, financial secretary, and Lyle Zobel, benevolence treasurer.

A reception will follow. Pastor Berner began work in the south Salem area last October. The first service was held in the present chapel at 3725 S. Commercial st. The congregation has purchased a parsonage and is negotiating the purchase of suitable highway property for a church site.

Having the favor of men is good but it is "a small thing compared to having the favor of God through Christian experience," the Rev. Atwood Foster, Oregon district superintendent of the Assemblies of God, told Salem Christian Businessmen's committee Friday.

Foster said Paul's writing in Corinthians that God had told him, "My grace is sufficient for thee," can be translated from the Greek as "my favor."

He pointed out that Paul considered he was favored by God despite the sufferings he underwent in his ministry. But Christianity must be remembered as "the way of the cross" and not as an easy path, he declared. Foster reminded that persecution has revived today against "those who take the name of Christ" in such lands as Russia, parts of South America, China and Korea.

Jews Observe Passover in Salem Homes

Salem's Jewish congregation began observance of Passover Friday evening with a brief service in Temple Beth Shalom and services in the homes. The latter will be repeated tonight.

The temple service was led by Dr. Robert A. Golden, president of the congregation, and Lou Horn. A congregational dinner is planned for 6 p.m. Sunday at the temple.

In the homes, the service is called "Hagada," the youngest son asks the head of the family four questions pertaining to "why is this night different from all other nights?" The Passover introduces seven-day feast of unleavened bread, symbolic of the haste of departure of the Hebrews from Egypt, under Moses, 1,200 years before the Christian era. The annual event commemorates that deliverance.

Ordinarily Passover coincides with the Christian Holy week, just prior to Easter. However, this is a leap year in the Jewish calendar, resulting in the loss of a full month to separate the two observances.

Leisure Activity of Youngsters Subject of Chest Agency Studies

By Winston H. Taylor How much time Salem youngsters have for leisure and how they spend it will be surveyed soon in a cooperative venture by Community Chest agencies serving youth.

Forms have just been received and will be distributed through the schools within a few days, according to Roth Holtz, chairman of the committee which has been planning the project for the past year. After preliminary planning, the questionnaires were checked, and revised many times to assure getting information useful in recreation planning.

The survey will cover children from the 4th through the 12th grade in Salem district public schools, and elementary pupils in St. Joseph's, St. Vincent de Paul and Keizer schools and Salem academy. Approximately 6,000 will be included.

Aims of the project are to learn the areas and children which are underserved recreationally and to show the general recreational picture in Salem.

Statistical study of the results will be made during the summer, in charge of Mrs. Holtz, in order that chest agencies may have the facts and figures in forming their fall programs. They also will be available to such public organizations as schools and churches.

The committee directing the work includes Holtz of the YMCA, Norma Wallace of YWCA, Lucy McAfee of Girl Scouts, Maj. Charles Bennett of Salvation Army, Howard Higby of Boy Scouts and Margaret Jane Syme of Camp Fire Girls. Holtz said school officials had cooperated closely in preparations.

Information that all ages are to give includes time spent after school on school activities such as sports, clubs, music, committees, membership and attendance in various youth groups; ability to swim 20 yards; frequency of attendance at Sunday school and church; participation in church league sports; frequency of movie attendance; readership of books, magazines and comic books; amount of listening to radio. Senior high students are to report how much time they spend on home study.

All are asked if they own a horse or bicycle, but for junior and senior high students the question is expanded to include motorbikes and cars and use of family cars.

Younger groups are questioned as to time spent playing in their neighborhood and whether it's on public playgrounds.
