Golfers Wait Shrine Tourney Here Sunday

Well over 100 assorted linksmen from all parts of the Willamette Valley are expected to tee off Sunday at Salem golf course in the Salem Shrine club's children's hospital benefit Calcutta Sweepstakes tournament. The single-day conclave will find championship fighters teeing off from 9 to 10 a. m., after which swimmers in the lesser flights will have their casts at the numerous valuable prizes being put up by Earl D. Bourland and his Shrine club committee.

All money obtained through entry fees will be given to the Shrine Hospital for crippled kids.

The first four finishers of each of the four flights will receive such prizes as golf clubs, caddy cars, bags, balls, etc. The winner of the championship flight also will come into possession of a trophy.

Championship flight will be on a straight medal basis for 18 holes, but play in the other flights will be "Ruddles" style—one point for bogey, two for par, three for birdies and four for eagles, plus three-fourth's of the individual's established handicap.

The tournament is open to all golfers be they capable of shooting par or several dozen strokes over it for 18 holes. Those with handicaps of 6-5 will play in the championship flight. Those with 6-12 are to be first fighters, 13-20 second fighters and 21-27 third fighters.

Entry blanks can be obtained from either the Salem or Oak Knoll courses and at 411 Masonic building in Salem. Golfers from Eugene, Corvallis, Albany and Lebanon, along with many from Salem and vicinity are already entered in the tourney.

General Mayhem With Autos... Stuntmen Also Compete In Sunday Show at Bowl

The 1951 International Championship Open Stunt competition will be held in conjunction with the Joie Chitwood Auto Daredevils thrill circus at Hollywood Bowl Sunday, starting at 8:30 p.m. Sanctioned by the International Stuntmen's Association and regulated by the strict I.S.A. rules, competition will take place in the broadjumping of new automobiles for distances of approximately 110 feet into space and over three other new cars racing underneath; crash-rolling automobiles for distance and consecutive rolls; obstacle racing on two wheels, precision driving and specialty events.

Team entries will bring together the world's leading stuntmen. In addition to the Joie Chitwood Auto Daredevils, the Bill Ward Canadian Aces, Vancouver, B.C., will compete, as will Harry Woolman's Hollywood Stuntmen, Hollywood, California, and Angel Lopez's Diablos del Timon, of Mexico City.

Individual entries will include Eward "Dutch" Schnitzer, Vienna, Austria; Teddy Scott, Seattle, Washington; Yam Oka, Tokyo, Japan; Pierre Armand, Paris, France; Robert LaBay, LeHavre, France; Charles Bridewell, Manchester, England; Guillermo Ramirez, Tijuana, Mexico; Bobby Craig, Pittsburgh, and a half-dozen other American entries.

Featured in the accompanying thrill circus will be the head-on crash of two automobiles at a mile-a-minute while the drivers remain at the wheel; crashing a solid, 20-ton wall of ice with a stock sedan, featured by Clark Gable in his latest picture "To Please a Lady," in which he starred as a Chitwood driver, and as a special attraction Lucky Walters, Charlotte, N.C., will blow himself up in a casket with 20 sticks of dynamite.

There will be 28 events altogether and a \$100,000 fleet of new cars and trucks will be used in all I.S.A. competitive events, as well as in many of the Chitwood thrill circus acts.
