

Britain Bars 'Water Babies'

English Won't Permit Slated Channel Swim

LONDON, June 22—(AP)—Florida water babies Bubba Tongay, five, and his sister Kathy, four, were tucked into a suburban hotel bed tonight under technical arrest.

The children and their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Russell Tongay of Miami, Fla., were barred entry into Britain by immigration authorities at London airport following widespread protests over the Tongay's plans to send the two youngsters on a channel swim.

The officials announced the family will be put on a New York bound plane tomorrow. They gave no reason for the ban except that it was made under the aliens order—which gives wide powers to refuse entry to foreigners.

The announcement that a British holiday camp firm had sponsored a channel swim for the two Tongay kids led to widespread protests in both America and Britain. Home Secretary Chuter Ede was asked in the Commons to bar the family, but he gave no such pledge at the time.

Crowds of newsmen greeted the Tongay's plane today. Then the immigration men stepped in, whisking the Tongays off to a private office. Reporters were barred during the next half hour while officials questioned the parents on their plans for the children.

After the discussion with Tongay, the immigration officials phoned their head office for instructions.

Tongay waited. Bubba and Kathy played. Then reporters listening at the door heard an official tell Tongay: "We have some bad news for you. After examining your case it has been decided by the home office that you can not stay."

Tongay began to argue, but was waved away.

McGinnis Field Opening Tonite

SILVERTON—The big opening of McGinnis field will get underway at 8:15 Saturday night when the Silverton Red Sox meet the Albany Alcos on the newly re-modeled ball park.

Benefit 'Stakes Draws Big Field Host of Swingers Vie Sunday in Shrine Meet

One of the bigger events on the local links agenda takes place at Salem Golf club Sunday as more than one hundred linksters of varying talents from the mid-Willamette valley area take part in the unique Salem Shrine club's one-day Calcutta Sweepstakes tournament, proceeds of which go to the Portland Shrine children's hospital.

The field has been split into four flights, according to handicaps, with top four men in each flight to get attractive prizes rounded up by the Shrine club committee under the chairmanship of Earl D. Bourland.

The championship flight, made up of divoters with handicaps from zero up to five, will operate over the 18 holes on a medal basis. The three lower flights will play under the "Roodies" system—one point for a bogey, two for par, three for birdies and four for eagles plus three-fourths of individual handicap.

The first flight is comprised of handicaps from 6-12, the second flight from 13-20 and the third will include swingers carrying handicaps from 21-27.

The victor in the championship flight qualifies for a handsome trophy. Numerous towns from throughout the valley, including Eugene, Albany, Corvallis and Lebanon, will be represented in the tourney.

First tee-offs in the tourney are set for 7 a.m. Sunday, with the final participants slated to get off the initial tees around noon.

The Championship flight contenders include such top-notchers as Jack Brande, Lebanon; Jack Owens, Albany and Win Needham, Jim Sheldon, Jack Russell, Wally Hug, Wendell Miller, who'll be among the Salem threats.
