

Russia Plans Iran Invasion Observer Says

NEW YORK, July 6 (AP)—American Broadcasting company correspondent Ray Brock said tonight that the Russian army is "preparing for a fullscale invasion of Iran."

In a report to his New York office from Ankara, Turkey, Brock said "Russian soldiers in tanks and jeeps conduct almost nightly forays across the Azerbaijan border in northern Iran to test Iranian defenses."

Brock quoted an "official U. S. army observer recently arrived from Tehran" as saying that the "red army is receiving the full cooperation of the Iranian communists (members of the Tudeh party) in these patrols across the border."

Brock said the U. S. army observer could not be named for security reasons but said he formerly was an O.S.S. agent during World War II.

Brock quoted him as saying that the Russians are arming the Iranian communists in the hope of an uprising and that "the Russians will then invoke the terms of an old Russo-Iranian treaty whereby the red army is permitted to come to the aid of the Iranian government."

Roosevelt Adds Bronze Star to Battle Awards

NEW YORK, July 6 (AP)—A bronze star medal was awarded posthumously today to Brig. Gen. Theodore Roosevelt, Jr.

The award made Roosevelt the winner of every combat medal of the U. S. government. Roosevelt died of a heart attack in Normandy at the age of 57.

The medal was given to his widow, Mrs. Roosevelt, by Lt. Gen. Willis D. Crittenden, first army commander. It was for "heroic action" at Les Andalous, Algeria, in 1942 when Roosevelt led a small patrol that held off a superior enemy force under heavy fire.

White Coed, Negro Youth Get License

VANCOUVER, Wash., July 6 (AP)—The county marriage license bureau today issued a license to wed for De Norval Unthank, 21, negro student from the University of Oregon, and Doris E. Burgess, 21, white co-ed from the same school.

An unidentified negro woman picked up the license, for which the couple applied three days ago. Unthank's parents said later the wedding would be held tomorrow, but did not disclose the site.

The two students, both from Portland, were involved in a campus controversy while dating at school last spring. Miss Burgess eventually moved from her sorority house, Gamma Phi Beta, and

the student newspaper charged others had brought pressure for her to move if she would not stop seeing Unthank. The sorority denied the charge.

Court Upholds Salem Zoning, Peddler Law

A Salem business zone establishment and a Bend peddlers ordinance were upheld by the Oregon supreme court Friday as the justices adjourned for their annual summer vacation.

The Salem zone change was made about two years ago to permit erection of a Portland General Electric substation. The change from residential zoning was opposed by John K. Holt, who lived nearby at N. 4th and South streets. Holt carried his fight to the courts. In Friday's opinion, Justice Arthur Hay upheld Circuit Judge Rex Kimmell who earlier had found the zone change legally made.

In the Bend ruling, the high court said cities have the authority to make it unlawful for peddlers or solicitors to call at homes. Chief Justice James T. Brand wrote the decision which found the Bend ordinance constitutional.
