Strengthened Squad Ready for Big Series

On the march for a berth in the state tournament next month, Salem's Capital Post No. 9 American Legion junior baseball squad, strengthened by the addition of four stalwarts from Woodburn and Silverton, tonight open initial inter-district play in a 6:30 o'clock clash at Waters field with the Sheridan club. Sheridan won the championship of the district involving Newberg, McMinnville, Yamhill, etc., and is reportedly a strong outfit that has loaded up with star players from other district entries also.

Second game of the playoff series that will send its winner a stride nearer the coveted state tournament berth will be played Friday night at Sheridan. The third, if necessary is to be played Sunday on a site to be determined by the flip of a coin.

On the mound for Coach Vince Genna's Capital Posters in the opener will be either Lowell Pearce or Ron Whittaker. Both have been pitching fine ball in recent games. The balance of Genna's lineup may undergo a few changes, however, as he might insert one or all of the four new additions. They are Catcher Ed Montgomery, and outfielder Rick Johnson of Silverton and Shortstop Scott Odgers and Pitcher Chub Larson of Woodburn.

Otherwise the regular Salem lineup has found Chuck Puhman at third, Jim Brown at short, Jim Rice at second, Phil Jantze at first, Jim Winter as catcher and Floyd Trussell, Bill Nelson and Chet Schmidt in the outfield.

Sheridan qualified as district champ by defeating Yamhill Tuesday in the final game of their playoff.

Powder Puffs' Also to Race In Hollybowl Meet Saturday

Another item on the something-new-and-different line has been added to Saturday night's stock car auto racing program by Valley Sports Promoter Mike Carty. A "powder puff" race, featuring women drivers, is to be the extracurricular activity.

In beating Niagara, 73-70, in Toledo on Dec. 14, 1950.

Three minutes before the game was over, Hogan said Toledo led by 17 points. The D.A. said that Ed Kaye, who is under \$50,000 bail in the alleged bribing of New York players, sent \$1,750 to Walker as a payoff. Hogan said Walker gave \$250 each to Muzi and McDonald and kept the remainder. All three are ex-servicemen and McDonald is president of the senior class.

Hogan, in stressing the cooperation of the three players, made it clear that there are no charges against them. There had been no law against bribing amateur athletes in Ohio, but starting Aug. 22 it will be punishable by a \$10,000 fine or a prison sentence of one to five years, or both.
