Member of French Cabinet Killed by Wife

ORLEANS, France, Aug. 12—(AP)—A promising young French politician who only yesterday won a post in the new French cabinet was shot to death by his pretty black-haired wife today after he told her he wanted a divorce.

He was 42-year-old Pierre Chevaller, who was named secretary of state for technical education, youth and sports in the cabinet of Premier Rene Pleven. Police said his wife, Yvonne, confessed to firing five shots from a revolver that killed him almost instantly.

Chevaller was mayor of war-devastated Orleans and a hero of the French resistance movement during World War Two. In private life he was a physician. She was a former midwife.

Chevaller was a close coworker of Premier Pleven. The premier, shocked by the news of the domestic tragedy, dispatched high officials from his office to investigate.

On Bad Terms
Friends said the couple had been on bad terms, and that she rarely accompanied him on his frequent trips to Paris made necessary because he was a deputy in the national assembly (lower house of the French parliament).

Police gave this account: A few days ago Mrs. Chevaller bought a small revolver and asked for permission to carry it on the grounds her husband had dangerous political enemies.

Chevaller had been in Paris for the past week as the cabinet crisis neared its end. She telephoned him several times yesterday and reproached him for failing to come home. He told his wife he could not leave.

But when they entered Leslie junior high, they ran across Laurel Herr, a newcomer to Salem, and added her to their group as pianist. Now, mostly they sing. Once in awhile they play as string trio; now and then do both. Laurel is first soprano, Carol second soprano and Sidney sings contralto.

"The biggest help," as all three girls admit, has been Mrs. Sidney Kromer, who has rehearsed them, business managed them, and kept their prodded when they needed it.

Mrs. Kromer, a cellist herself, once played with the Portland Symphony orchestra. It was she who gave them their name, but none can remember the occasion which brought that forth. MYRTLE CREEK, Ore., Aug. 12—(AP)—Two persons were burned to death in a fire that leveled a suburban home one mile south of here early today.

They were tentatively identified as Elsworth Martin, about 50, and his wife of two weeks, the former Iris Evans, about 38. It was her home that burned.

The bodies, burned beyond recognition, were found in a charred bed in what had formerly been a sleeping porch. A burned blanket was found outside the house.

Orville Cornett, Myrtle Creek police chief, said three cars were burned in the blaze.
