Oregon's Big Chicken Flocks Small Fry by Eastern Standards

A 1,000- or 2,000-chicken flock may seem like quite a sizeable group to the average Oregon farmer who runs a few chickens on his farm, but it's just small fry to what eastern poultry men have. Clem Norton, state leader of the poultry and egg board, told a group of poultry dealers and others who attended a luncheon Friday at Senator hotel, honoring Gov. Douglas McKay.
"In the big chicken places in the east," Norton said, "one man takes care of 40,000 chickens. Here we run to 1,000 and 2,000 flocks for a fair sized group and you really can't make money on so small a number."
"We have changed in recent years from a large exporting to a large importing state so far as poultry products are concerned," Noel Bennion, poultry expert at Oregon State college, told the group. "We consume 25 to 30 per cent more eggs and 49 per cent more poultry than we did 10 years ago," he went on, adding that "this is due largely to the increased population in the state—with which our poultry industry has not kept up—and somewhat to the fact that poultry has been the cheapest form of meat for the housewife to purchase in recent years."

Bennion also pointed out that other forms of "work" had proved more lucrative and many men formerly in the poultry business are now in the lumber industry. That the chicken fryer business in the nation has been stepped up greatly in recent years was emphasized by Fred Cockell, Milwaukie poultryman and also a member of the state board of agriculture. "Twelve years ago we consumed 50 million fryers. Last year it took us 600 million to get enough," were the figures he gave.
H. H. Goodrich, state chairman of the feed dealers division of the Poultry and Egg board, said that 60 per cent of the feed milled in Oregon was consumed by chickens and turkeys.
Barry Brownell, Milwaukie, state chairman of the poultry and egg national board and chairman of the luncheon, explained that in
