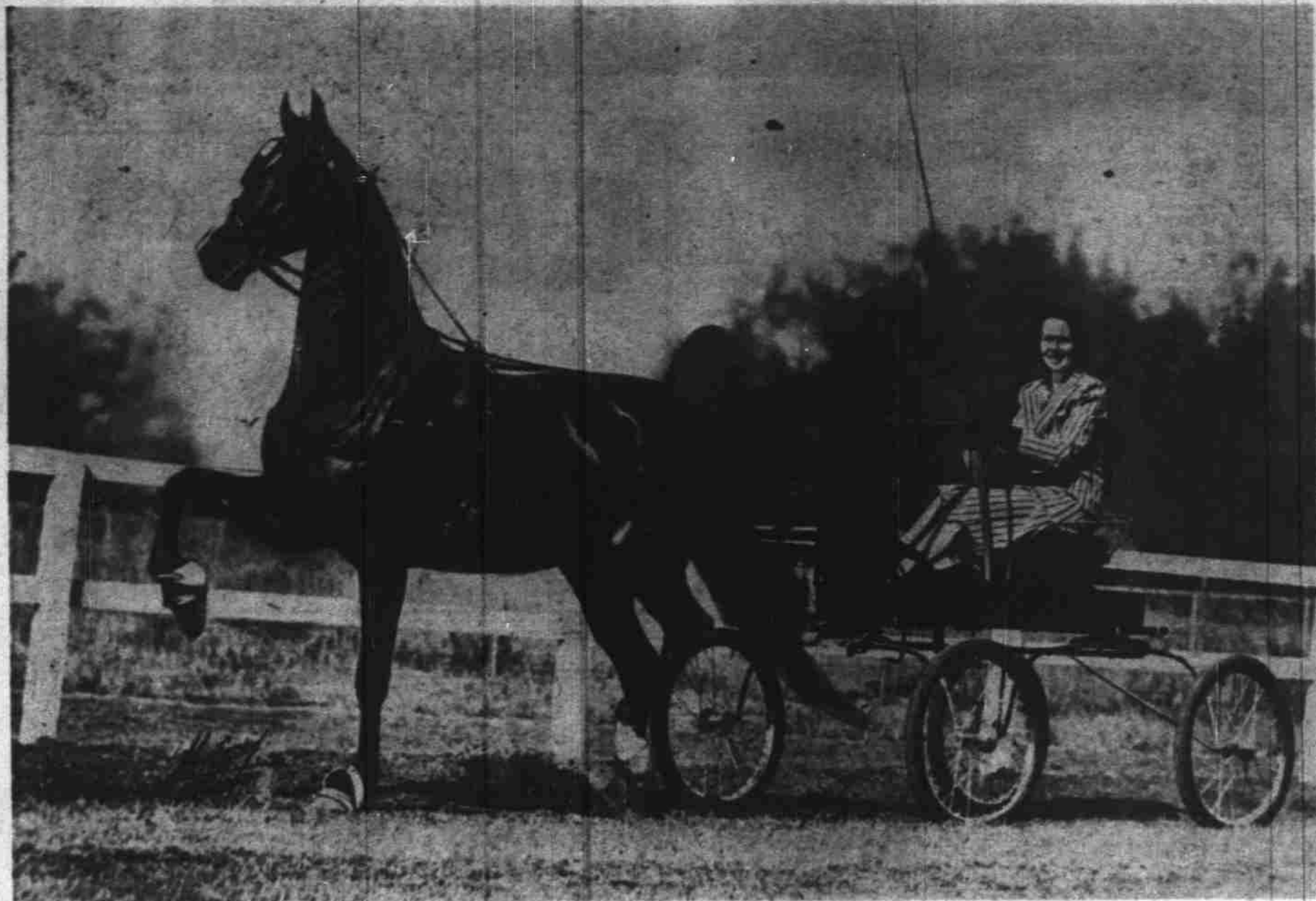


# Headed For The State Fair...
