

Bricklayer Accused of Making Teeth

FLINT, Mich., Aug. 29—(AP)—August E. Lindstrom, 42, was haled into municipal court on a charge of practicing dentistry without a license. His accuser was a Flint man who said he hired Lindstrom to make him a set of false teeth. The set didn't work very well, the man charged. The accused stood mute, and a plea of innocent was entered for him. Lindstrom is a bricklayer by profession.

Hawaiian Grand Jury Indicts Seven on Communist Charge

Senator Asks Judge Fired for Cutting Bail

HONOLULU, Aug. 29—(AP)—A federal grand jury today indicted Hawaii labor leader Jack W. Hall and six other accused communists on a charge of plotting to advocate the violent overthrow of the U. S. government. The indictment linked the seven with communist party headquarters in New York. The grand jury unanimously requested Federal Judge Delbert E. Metzger, because of the "seriousness of the charges," to increase the \$5,000 bail he set for each of the seven. The judge later increased the bail to \$7,500. Acting U. S. Attorney Howard K. Hodrick promptly filed an affidavit requesting disqualification of Metzger "at the request of the U. S. attorney general." The grand jury's indictment cited by name William Z. Foster,

Eugene Dennis and 11 other top American communists as co-conspirators, but not co-defendants. Arrested by FBI.

The seven alleged communists were arrested by FBI agents yesterday in a dramatic dawn roundup.

The grand jury for two days had listened to unidentified witnesses. Hall is Hawaii regional director of Harry Bridges' International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union. Under its banner are massed the sugar and pineapple workers of Hawaii's two principal industries.

Free on \$5,000 bail, Hall flew to Hilo on the big southern island of Hawaii early today. He is conducting wage talks there with representatives of the islands' \$120,000,000 sugar industry.

If agreement is not reached by Friday midnight, Hall has threatened to call out 18,500 plantation workers in an island-wide strike.

U. S. Commissioner Harry Steiner originally set bail at \$75,000 each for the seven but this was slashed to \$5,000 each by Judge Metzger. All seven made bail and were released pending a preliminary hearing Thursday.

Draws Protest
In Washington, Metzger's action in lowering the bond drew an angry protest from Senator O'Mahoney (D-Wyo), chairman of the senate interior and insular affairs committee, who termed it an "outrageous act."

O'Mahoney predicted Metzger would be speedily replaced on recommendation of Interior Secretary Oscar Chapman. He said the judge's term had expired last year.

Metzger defended his action and said: "I suppose Senator O'Mahoney

thinks he knows more of the situation here than I do. I don't think so."

Metzger said that bail of more than \$5,000 "would be an unlawful burden on these people... they shouldn't be punished because they are accused."

He said his six-year term expires Sept. 28, 1951.

Connally Asks Senate to Vote Foreign Aid

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29—(AP)—Declaring that the United States "cannot stand alone in a hostile world," Senator Connally (D-Tex.) asked the senate today to vote \$7,535,750,000 for the aid of nations arrayed against communism. The chairman of the senate's foreign relations committee said the huge program was designed to carry out a fundamental policy already approved by congress.

Majority leader McFarland (D-Ariz.) called for a vote on the bill before the end of the week.

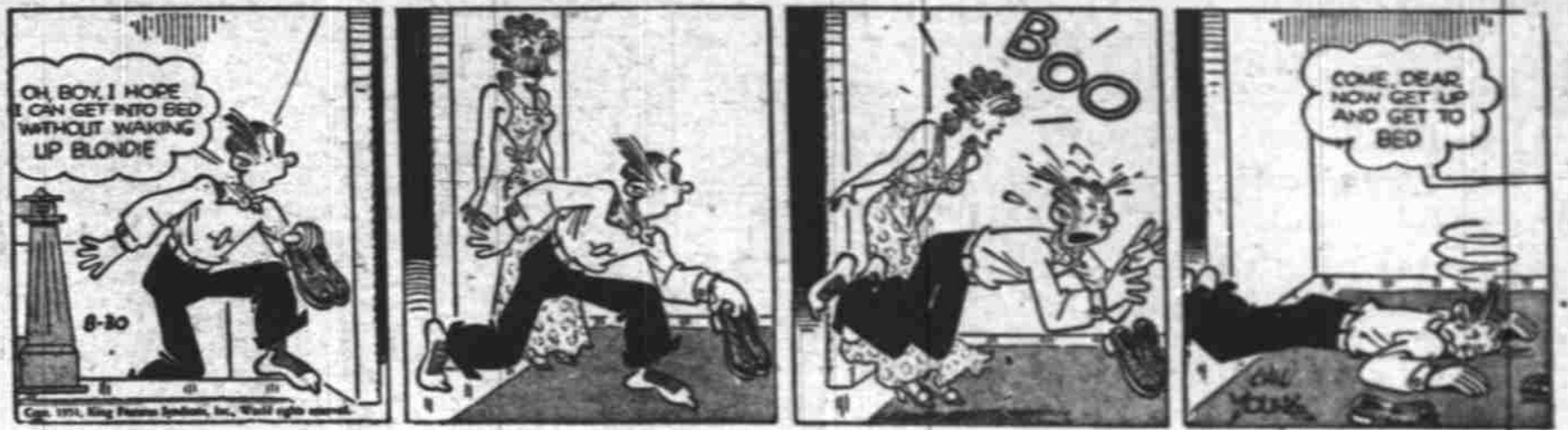
Senator Moody (D-Mich.) in another statement on the bill, described it as "too small and too slow."

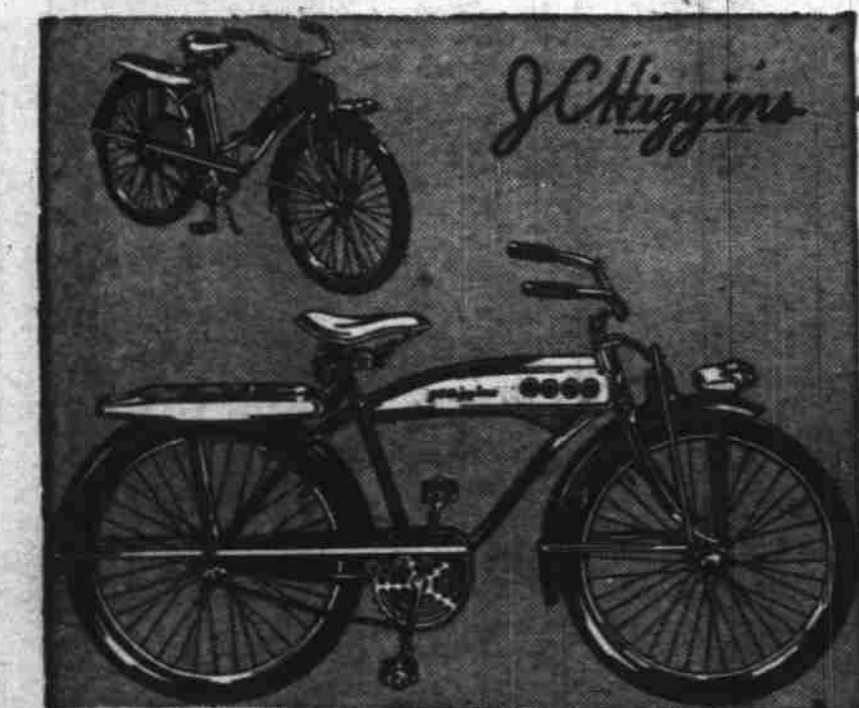

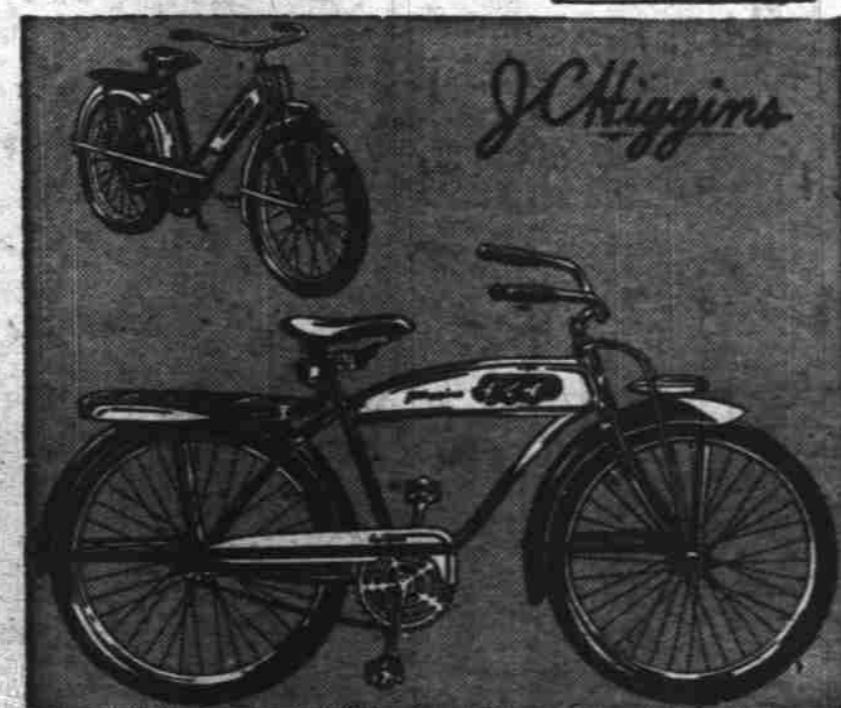
