National Loop Prexy Handed Highest Berth

CHICAGO, Sept. 20-(AP)-Ford Frick, president of the National League, was named commissioner of baseball tonight to succeed A. B. Chandler.

The new commissioner was chosen for the \$65,000 a year post at a closed session of the 16 major league club owners at the Palmer House.

Frick, who was prominently mentioned as a successor to Judge K. M. Landis in 1945, has long been identified with baseball, first as a newspaperman in the west and in New York City, and since 1934 as president of the National League. He is 56 years old.

Seven-Year Pact
The term will be for seven years at an annual salary of \$65,000," said the announcement.

The final ballot was unanimous, 16 to 0. Mr. Warren Giles moved that his name be withdrawn and moved for a unanimous vote.

Frick and Giles were the only two candidates voted on during the long sessions. Approximately 20 ballots were taken in all.

The baseball owners decided at the outset of the day to choose a man from the ranks of the game to become the third commissioner of baseball.

The vacancy in the National League presidency will be dealt with in the immediate future," said the announcement.

Frick, who had been in Florida for the funeral of Bill Klem, famous umpire, returned today to New York and accepted the baseball commissionership by telephone.

Del Webb of the New York Yankees, who acted as chairman of the executive session, said jokingly afterward, "It seemed like 50 ballots were taken, but it might have been only 30."
