

Iran Premier Fires Blast at 'World Rulers'

TEHRAN, Iran, Sept. 30 — (AP)—Premier Mohammed Mossadegh attacked the "rulers of the world" tonight as the United Nations security council prepared to take up Britain's complaint against Iran in the oil controversy.

Mossadegh did not say whom he meant by the "rulers," but declared that "they handcuff the weak and hasten to the assistance of the strong."

The premier made a radio broadcast thanking the Iranian people for their support in his dispute with Britain over nationalizing the country's oil. Earlier in the day, his parliamentary opposition joined him in a solid patriotic front. There was a possibility the wispy premier might fly to New York for a dramatic personal appearance before the security council.

'Not for Others'
"They (the 'rulers of the world') love liberty but not for others," Mossadegh said in his broadcast. "They recognize property rights but only in order to usurp the rights of the weak."

He made no mention of the security council session Monday or whether he would appear before the council. Deputy Premier Hosein Fatemi had said earlier Mossadegh would make the trip to New York if the council decides it is competent to pass on the oil dispute. Iran contends that the oil question is strictly an internal affair.

Nearly all stores in this city of nearly 1,000,000 were closed all morning in response to Khashan's call for a "Hate Britain day."

There were reports that Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi had put his private plane, a converted Flying Fortress, as Mossadegh's disposal should he decide to go to New York.

Boycott Ends
For the first time in three weeks, opposition deputies today attended the majlis, lower house of parliament. Their presence ended the boycott that has prevented a quorum. Fourteen opposition members signed a resolution declaring they would support Mossadegh in the security council action "to show the world Iranian national unity must be preserved whenever there is a dispute between our country and a foreign country."

At Abadan, site of the nationalized Anglo-Iranian Oil Co.'s huge refinery, firebrand Hussein Makki, Mossadegh's right-hand man in the oil territory, declared that nothing could stop the expulsion of the remaining British technicians there. The Britons have been ordered to leave the country by Thursday. Makki told newsmen the expulsion decision would not be altered by a trip to New York by the premier.

Makki said Iranian police will escort to the frontier any Britons left in Abadan by Thursday.

Disappearance of Gems Baffles Cops

NEW YORK, Sept. 30 — (AP)—The disappearance of gems valued at around \$100,000 from the home of Mrs. Alisa Bruce, daughter of the late Andrew Mellon, had police baffled today.

DR. MICHELFELDER DIES
CHICAGO, Sept. 30 — (AP)—The Rev. Dr. S. C. Mischelfelder, 62, executive secretary of the Lutheran World Federation and noted for his work in church relief and reconstruction in Europe during the last five years, died today.

SUGAR BEETS PROCESSED
SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 29 — (AP)—Processing of sugar beets was underway today in two plants of the Utah-Idaho Sugar company and additional factories will open soon. The company said the Toppenish, Wash., plant began grinding beets September 20 and the plant at Idaho Falls began operations yesterday.

3 Hospitalized By Two-Car Wreck at Eola

All three injured were taken by City Ambulance service to Salem General hospital where they were held overnight with undisclosed injuries.

The Davis car went over a bank onto the railroad tracks at the scene. While the ambulance was en route to the hospital, Thomas E. Wilson, Dallas lawyer who said he was a friend of Davis, was arrested in Salem by city police on a charge of following an emergency vehicle too close.

Wilson posted \$20 bail on the charge.

Gay Festival of Britain Closes

LONDON, Sept. 30 — (AP)—The gay, gaudy festival of Britain on the south bank of the Thames in London was shut down tonight with a burst of pageantry and song.

A crowd estimated at 36,000 jammed the festival area and sang "God Save the King" and "Auld Lang Syne" while batteries of searchlights thrust fingers through the night sky.

Then, in dead silence, the Union Jack and the festival flag were lowered slowly. Drums rolled and the lights of the exposition began to go out.

The festival was opened on May 4 by King George. It has been visited by 8,455,883 persons from all parts of the world.

Senators State Truman Curbs Free Press

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 — (AP)—Twenty-five republican senators declared today "some persons and groups" in the Truman administration are using "sneaky tactics and propaganda techniques" to silence opposition.

"There is evidence," the GOP lawmakers said, "that no man can criticize our government today and escape late-temperate reprisals." They set forth their views in a manifesto which Senator Ferguson (R-Mich.), one of the signers, said was aimed for the most part at "moves by the administration to curb freedom of speech and the press."

Ferguson told a reporter the drafters—led by Senator Bridges (R-NH)—had in mind such things as President Truman's executive order last week standardizing and tightening the handling of security information by government agencies. The order specified it should not be used to stifle the flow of news to the public.

Senator Bricker (R-Ohio, who also signed today's statement, has introduced a bill to wipe the Truman order off the books.

MRS. BANISTER DIES

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 — (AP)—Mrs. Blair Banister, assistant treasurer of the United States, died today. She was in her 70s. Mrs. Banister, a sister of the late Senator Carter Glass (D-Va.), visited her office regularly until recent weeks.

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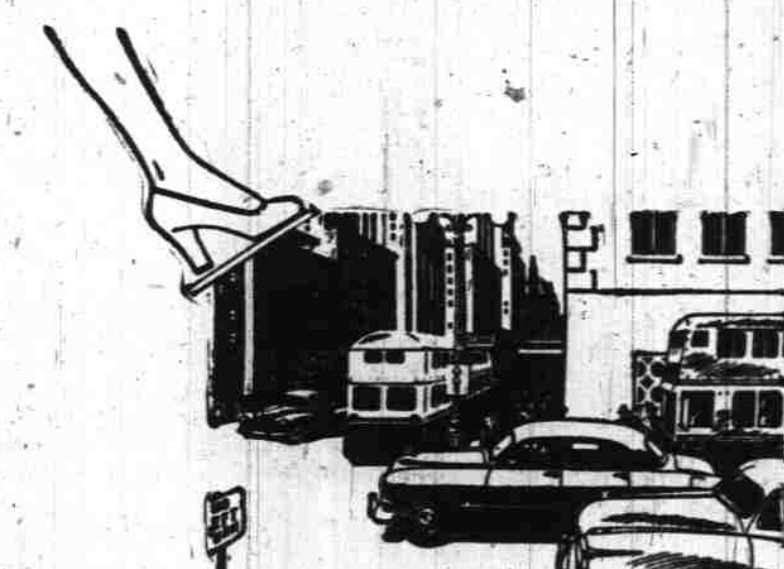
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
