## Six Injured In Crash of Bus, Sedan

Six persons were injured, none seriously, when their car and a bus collided Thursday afternoon at Hood and Winter streets. The impact threw three of them from the vehicle.

Mrs. Walter Johnson of Lebanon, driver of the car, and Johnny Wheeler, 8 of Lebanon, a passenger, were at Salem General hospital. Mrs. Johnson suffered from shock and other undetermined injuries and was in "good" condition. The boy required several stitches to close head lacerations and was in "fair" condition.

The Portland-bound Trailways bus, driven east on Hood street by James E. Eller, sr., of Portland, rammed into the left side of the Johnson car. The car was badly damaged, but the bus was able to proceed. None of its 23 passengers was hurt.

Eller told city police he was entering the intersection when he saw the Johnson car pass another one, headed north. Mrs. Almdea Wheeler of Lebanon, passenger in the car, said she saw the bus just before the crash.

Others in the car were Mrs. Mary Balding, 566 Mill st., with nose lacerations and a broken foot bone; Mrs. Wheeler, with bruised forehead and hips, and two children, Joanna Johnson of Lebanon, a bloody nose, and Stephen Balding, 4, cut eyelid.

## With Chamber Increased Bus Service Plan For State Workers Discussed

A move to improve city bus service for state employees by dismissing bus riding workers before the 5 o'clock rush resulted Thursday from a conference of officials of the city, the bus system, the state and state employees' association.

Men at the conference were enthusiastic about the plan which will be presented to the state board of control Tuesday by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry.

If approved, the plan would permit certain state workers to shorten their lunch periods by 15 minutes and then leave work at 4:45 p.m. instead of 5 p.m.

City buses would leave the state buildings' area between 4:50 and 4:55 p.m. on eight principal routes. Riders from the statehouse area would travel direct to their destination without transfer. At present bus users from the state area either go downtown to catch a bus or wait until about 5:20 for a bus.

The bus plan is an outgrowth of discussions among state, city and university officials over parking and traffic congestion in the state area.

Officials at the conference yesterday said the bus plan would encourage greater use of buses by state workers; might thus alleviate some auto parking congestion; would expedite the elevator traffic in state buildings at the rush hour and would tend to reduce traffic congestion at 5 o'clock.

If the plan goes through City Transit lines expects to route its morning buses past the state buildings at about 7:50 a.m. for the benefit of state employees.

A recent state survey indicated about 138 workers use city buses to and from work. Bus Manager Carl Wendt said yesterday that this figure might go up to about 200 under the new system, and he expected that it would make bus service generally more attractive to state employees.

## Death Takes H. B. Howdle, Navy Veteran

Harmon Barrett Howdle, 57, of 575 Boone rd., a retired navy aviation chief ordnance man who had been attending Willamette university, died Wednesday at a local hospital after a short illness.

Howdle came to Salem in 1947 in order that his daughter could go to school at Willamette. He began taking courses there a year ago, majoring in sociology. Before starting at the university he had worked in the office of the secretary of state.

Born in Chicago on Feb. 20, 1894, Howdle joined the navy in 1913. He was married to his widow, Lola Howdle, at Pensacola, Fla., in 1919. He retired from the navy in 1937, but was recalled to duty in World War II.

Besides his widow, he is survived by two daughters, Helen Howdle of Salem; and Mrs. Louise Perry of Toledo, Ohio; his mother, Mrs. Frank Howdle, of Wendell, Idaho; a sister, Mrs. Carl Martin, also of Wendell, Idaho; and four grandchildren.

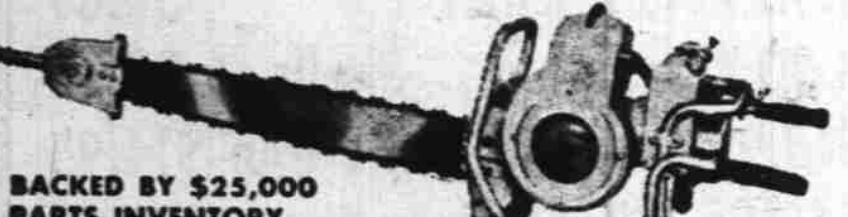
