## Salem Rotary Club Hears Maj. Campion

The air force reserve officer training program, such as Williamette university started this fall, is aimed at securing trained men to strengthen the U. S. in the world situation, Maj. Norman W. Campion of the staff told Salem Rotary club Wednesday.

Campion pointed out the "unbalance" of the democracies and other countries in area, population and natural resources. To overcome that democratic disadvantage, all resources must be used in the best way and "everyone must do a job," he declared.

He said students can gain some military service deferment through the program. They enroll in the school's air science department, which has a two-year basic curriculum, including world political geography, meteorology, aerodynamics and defense organization.

Students picked for the advanced phase by the military and Williamette faculty, he added, can specialize in administration and logistics or preflight. This two years provides pay and summer camp for the enrollees.

Work is correlated with school project to earn a group contribution or made a voluntary contribution earned or saved by personal effort or sacrifice.

In each school a council of students meets with a teacher-sponsor to plan activities then interprets the projects to home rooms where the work is carried on.

Requests for projects from hospitals, organizations and International Red Cross are forwarded to the school groups by the Marion county Junior Red Cross committee.
