

# State's Prep Gridders Enter Quarterfinals

Oregon's title-bound prep footballers were Monday looking to the quarter-final round in the Class A division and the semi-finals in both the Class B and six-man groups. The playoffs get under way last weekend with the following results:

**Class A-1:** Grant of Portland 21, Bend 6; Astoria 22, Hillsboro 7; Grants Pass 25, Maristfield 12; Mac-Hill 24, Roosevelt of Portland 12. **Class A-2:** Columbia Prep 6,

Toledo 7 (Toledo winner via more first downs); North Marion 14, Canby 14 (North Marion winner via more first downs); Coquille 20, University of Eugene 6; Vale 19, Prineville 7. **Class B:** Gervais 12, Knappa 7; Wallawa 32, John Day 6; Creswell 19, Drain 6; Phoenix 20, Maupin 6. **Six-man:** Vale 19, Westport 18; Coburg 21, Riddle 24.

In the Class A category this week the A-1 winners of last weekend will go against three of A-2 which also won opening round tilt. Sites and times of the respective games are to be determined this week by the competing schools and the governing Oregon High Schools Activities association.

**Class A-1 vs. A-2 games this week:** Grant of Portland vs. Toledo, Astoria vs. North Marion, Grants Pass vs. Coquille and Mac Hill vs. Vale. **Class B games scheduled for this week:** Gervais vs. Creswell and Phoenix vs. Wal-

lowa. In six-man football it will be Vale vs. Coburg in one of the semi-final battles. All Class A-1 schools will naturally be favored to topple their Class A-2 foes this week. But on the basis of their first-round showings Toledo, Coquille and Vale aren't to be taken lightly by their larger adversaries. The Coquille and Vale victories of last week were considered upsets, as was the Mac-Hill triumph over powerful Roosevelt of Portland.

## Veterans Lag As Cats Step Up Hoop Drills

With the distraction of the football season now out of the way, Willamette university's basketball 16-man squad Monday started stepping up preparations for the opening of the 1951-52 campaign against Oregon State here Dec. 1st.

Coach John Lewis will get 10 men previously busy with football as additions to his squad. They are Benny Holt, the freshman quarterback whose best sport is said to be the cage game, and Layton Gilson, sophomore post candidate.

Lewis has not been exactly happy with the performance of his veterans in the first two weeks of drills. Most of them have been slow to round into form.

### Grid Stands Out

One of the standouts in Monday morning's practice was Daryl Girod, the former Salem high star, who is in the freshman category even though a transfer from Oregon State. Girod is given a good chance of landing a regular guard spot. A much improved performer is Claude Nordhill, reserve guard last season but transferred to a forward post this year.

The seven lettermen in contention for regular jobs are Ted Loder, Doug Logue, Larry Smith, Lou Scrivens, Hugh Bellingier, Nordhill and Dick Brouwer. The squad also includes three varsity reserves from last campaign in Bob Smith, Cliff Girod and Ray Williams and two transfers in Dick Mase and Bob Shepard.

The lone other freshman making a varsity bid, in addition to Daryl Girod, is Dick Hoy, six-foot guard candidate from Newberg.

In a strong criticism of college coaches, the court continued: "The naive, the equivocation and the denials of the coaches and their assistants concerning their knowledge of gambling, recruiting and subsidizing would be comical were they not so despicable." The general sessions judge conceded "there are still hundreds of excellent colleges and universities."

But college athletics by and large, he added, "has become big business."
