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Nine Indicted By Grand Jury

Nine persons were indicted Wednesday by a Marion county grand jury, six of them on charges of escaping from the state penitentiary. One indictment was secret.

The escapees, the date of their flights and the charges for which they are serving time are:

Jesse James Payne, August 1, burglary; William Theodore Russell, July 7, burglary; James Clinton Anderson, May 18, manslaughter; Earl Oren Jones, June 19, 1943, rape; James Russell Frost, November 10, receiving and concealing stolen property; Leonard Hugh Hainey, November 10, forgery.

Also indicted were Sherman Plumb, Woodburn, on a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, involving the alleged giving of alcoholic liquor to a minor; Benjamin H. Shattuck, Bremerton, Wash., on a charge of non-support.

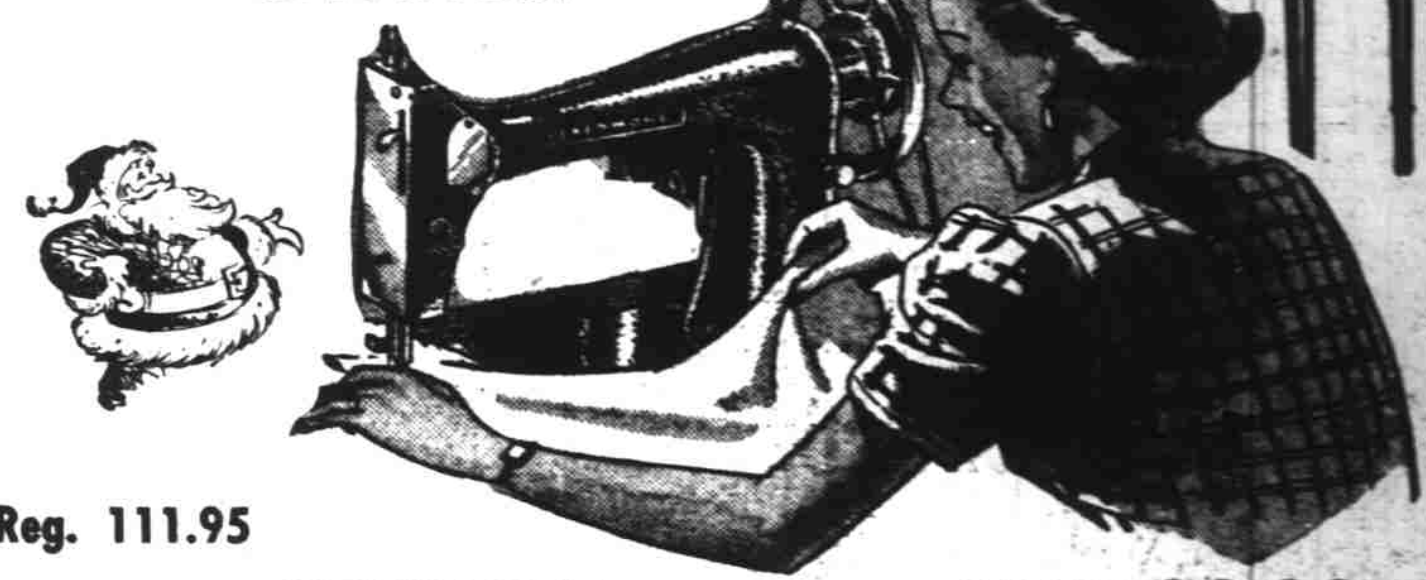
