## Gear Failure Keeps Airliner Aloft 2 Hours

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 20 — (AP) — A TWA plane enroute from San Francisco to New York with 52 persons aboard made an uneventful night landing at Los Angeles municipal airport after circling the field for two hours because the nose wheel did not come down with the landing gear.

The pilot, Capt. John George, said the crew succeeded in switching over the hydraulic system and putting sufficient pressure forward to control the nose wheel.

Among the passengers were George Jessel and Charles P. Skouras, president of National Theaters, Inc.

"I was really scared," said Jessel. "I was praying in Catholic, Jewish and Mohammedan prayers. We were all apprehensive, and the flight engineer was down there working on that wheel all the time we were circling."

"Everybody went to the back of the plane to shift the weight for the landing," Capt. George said he had an hour's supply of gasoline when he put the wheels down.

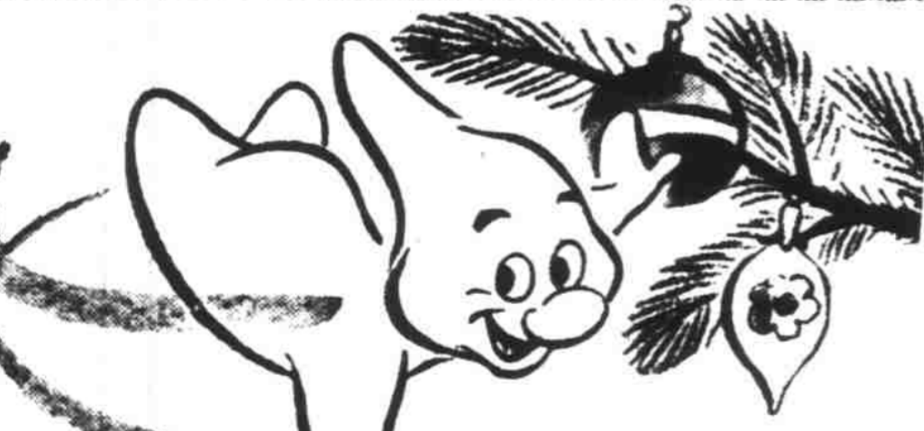
