## 'Quakes' to Aid Excavation At Vatican City

NEW YORK, Dec. 24—Man-made earthquakes will be used to locate long-buried remains of ancient civilization in Vatican City, Francis J. LeBuffe reports in the January issue of The Catholic Digest.

Father Joseph Lynch, S.J., of Fordham university and Father Daniel Eipehan, S. J., of Boston college, will attempt to determine, by their earthquakes, the exact location of Nero's Circus, believed to be somewhere near Saint Peter's tomb.

A set of ten seismographs, each ten feet apart, will be set above ground and a quarter to an eighth pound of dynamite inserted underground at one end. The resulting tremors, recorded on the seismographs, are expected to show where excavations can be started for Nero's Circus of the first century A. D.

"We know the different speeds of earthquake waves in all known strata. By merely recording the speed of any wave we make, we can conclude what material it has passed through," Father Lynch explains.

## Derailed Cars Smash Station

TIPPECANOE, Ind. Dec. 24—(P) Twelve coal cars of a Nickel Plate freight train left the tracks and smashed the Tippecanoe railroad station early Sunday.

The station was closed at the time of the wreck, 4:25 a.m., and no one was hurt.

Only two walls of the station were left standing.

Nickel Plate officials estimated the damage at \$50,000.

## Silverton Man Faces Charge

A 57-year-old Silverton man was held last night in the Marion county jail charged with obtaining money by false pretenses following his arrest on a five-year-old warrant.

Sheriff's deputies said Carl Thomas Marlow disappeared in 1946 after obtaining about \$800 in a loan which he never paid back. Marlow has also served a term in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kan., on the same charge. He was held in lieu of \$2,500 bail.

## MacKenzie's Son Suffocates During Fire

Victor Keith MacKenzie, 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Vic MacKenzie of Salem, died of suffocation Sunday night at Carmel, Calif., friends of the family learned here Monday.

Young MacKenzie was to have entered the United States naval academy at Annapolis next year after having received an appointment from Sen. Wayne Morse in September.

Only Saturday MacKenzie had returned to Carmel from Bainbridge, Md., where he was preparing for the academy entrance examination. He was staying at the home of a friend when he was suffocated by a mattress fire while he slept.

Born in Portland, he had lived most of his life in Carmel with his family, though they maintained legal residence in Salem.

Salem friends learned that funeral services will be held Wednesday, followed by cremation. The ashes will be returned here for services at Mt. Crest Abby mausoleum.

MacKenzie's father has long

been identified nationally with the American Legion and both parents are prominent in republican political circles.
