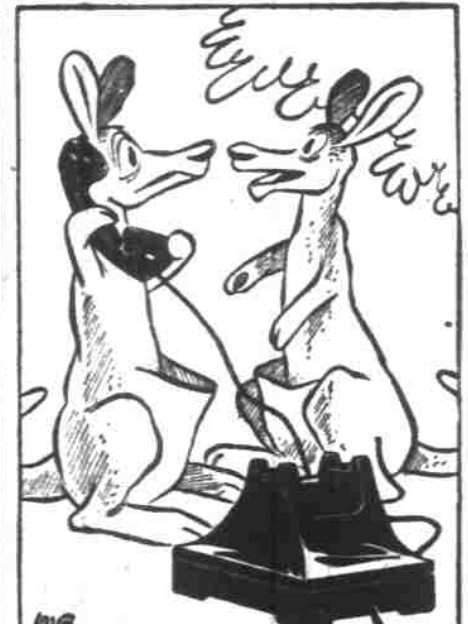
Linn County Drops Names of 4,062 Registered Voters

Remaining on the poll books are the names of 19,918 voters. Eliminated were those who had not voted in the past two years, or were known to have moved from the county or to have died.

Officials believe that new registrations between now and the spring primary elections will more than offset the reduction.
