Guido Contelli, young Italian conductor who came to the United States under the sponsorship of Toscanini, will conduct the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra for the first time on the air today. 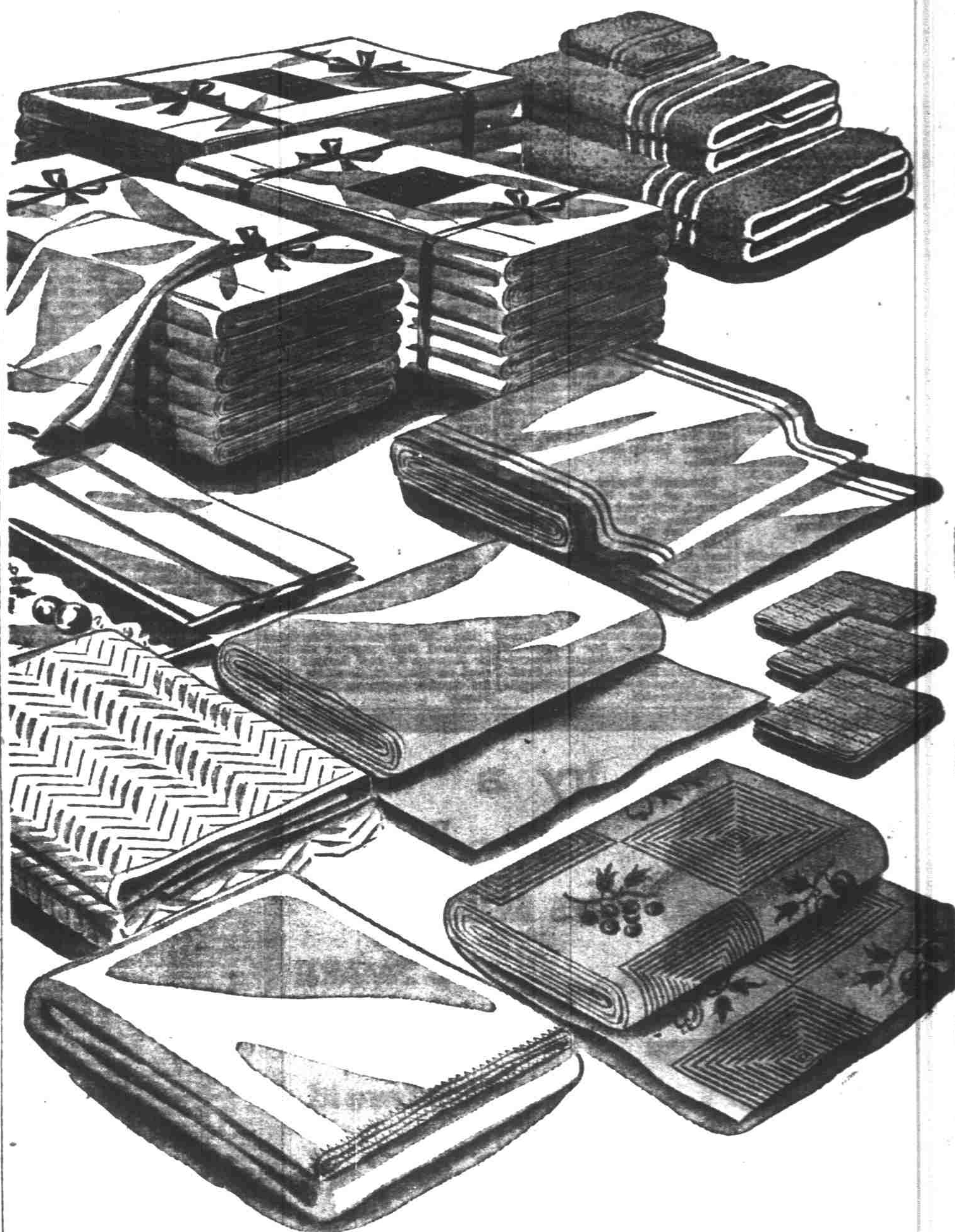
