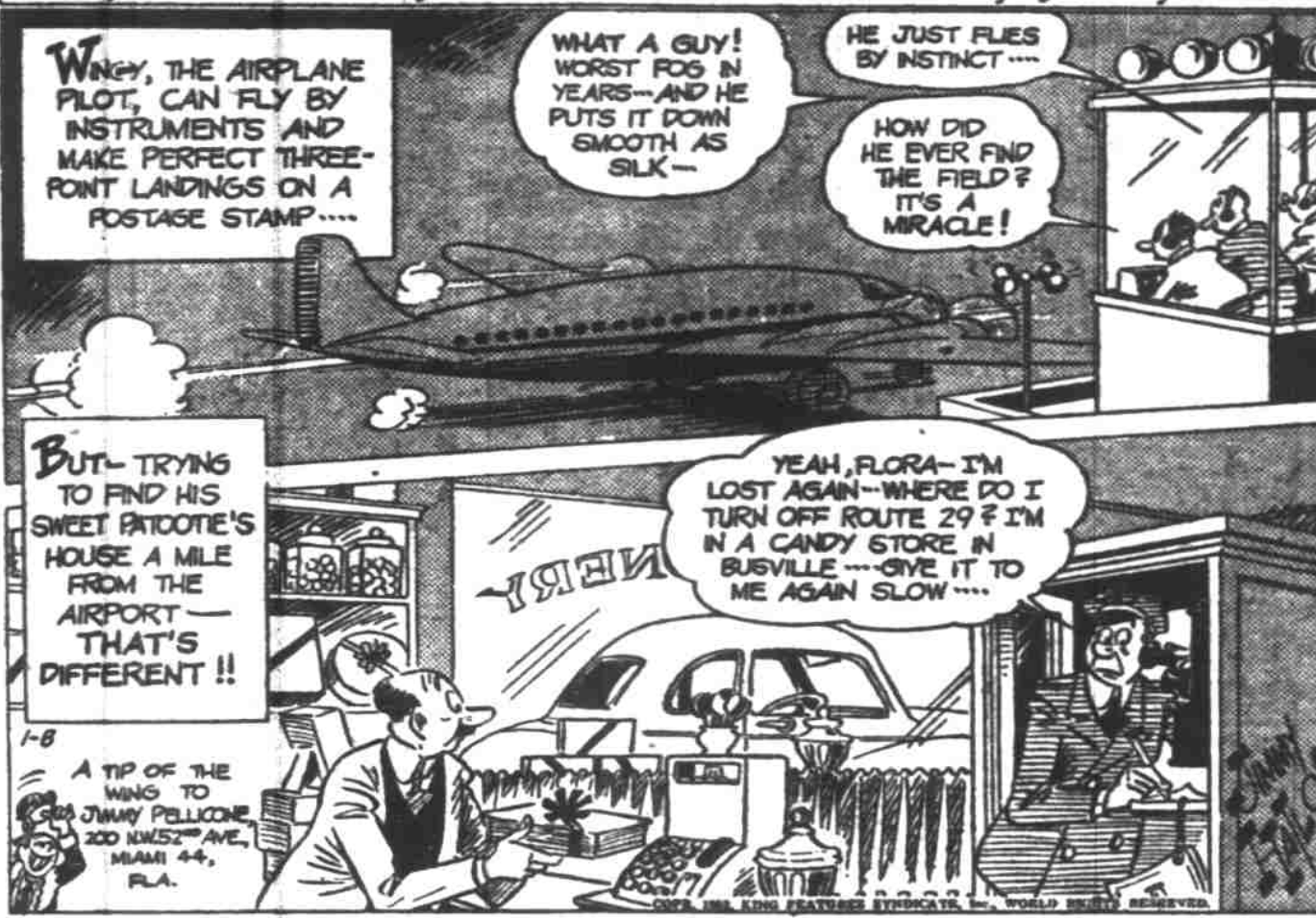
9 Major Teams Still Unbeaten

Dr. Hannah stressed that all existing contracts would be honored. This means that Bowl games in which conference have agreements that still have a year or two to run would be played until the contracts run out.

He said that it also meant that athletes holding athletic scholarships would keep them. Hannah pointed out Sunday the job of enforcing this program would rest with the accrediting association of the country. A school which got out of line athletically, he said, would risk its academic standing.

But Monday Hannah said: "We hope that the schools, the NCAA and the conferences all bring themselves in line so that this will work."

HONOLULU (AP)—Hank Lauricella, talented Tennessee tailback, was added to the roster of the College All-Stars who face the pro Hawaii All-Stars Friday night in a second Hula Bowl charity football game.

The collegiates measured the pros in Sunday's first game 41-40, with a line-up that featured 15 mainland college aces. The college team had a 20-0 lead after seven minutes and a 41-19 margin later in the game.

The Hawaii pros shoved over three touchdowns in the last quarter as the collegians appeared to coast. They whittled that 22-point bulge down to a single point but could not overcome it.

The game's running star was Washington's Hugh McElhenney who romped 56 yards for the third college touchdown and broke away for 47 late in the game.
