

U.N. Kills Red Plan to Discuss Korean Truce

PARIS (AP)—The U. N. Political Committee killed Russia's attempt to place the Korean truce negotiations before the Security Council Wednesday and then postponed consideration of the whole Korean issue until an armistice is reached at Panmunjom.

The committee's action could have the effect of taking the Korean issue out of this Sixth General Assembly unless an armistice is reached before mid-February, when the delegates hope to adjourn.

The vote against Russia's demand that the Korean negotiations be referred to a high level meeting of the Security Council—where the Russians have used the veto often—was 40 to six. Burma joined the Soviet bloc in this vote. There were 11 abstentions.

The committee then recommended that the Security Council have a top-drawer session whenever the Council believed such a meeting would remove international tensions and help friendly relations between countries. The vote for this was 50 in favor and none opposed.

Protestants in Canada Said Persecuted

PORTLAND (AP)—Protestants are being persecuted in Canada, the Rev. H. C. Phillips of Vancouver, B. C., told a conference of First Southern Baptists here.

The Rev. Phillips, pastor of the Ruth Morton Memorial Baptist Church, said that during the past four years in Quebec a number of Protestant missionaries, including many Baptists, have been jailed and even beaten by mobs for holding street revivals.

"The charge against these men is 'unauthorized assembly,' yet the fact is their street meetings were orderly and did not interfere with traffic. . . . The origin of the persecution lies in Roman Catholic bigotry. It is difficult to obtain legal defense for the jailed missionaries, because Quebec lawyers hesitate to take their cases," he said.

The Rev. Phillips was one of several speakers at the Baptists' Evangelistic Conference here. Purpose of the conference is to train Oregon and Washington church leaders in methods of evangelism and revival meetings.

Morse Aid Mentioned for NLRB Post

WASHINGTON—Ivar H. Peterson, administrative assistant to Sen. Wayne Morse, is being prominently mentioned as the leading candidate for a \$15,000-a-year membership on the National Labor Relations Board.

Before taking a position on Morse's staff in 1948, Peterson was for 7½ years an NLRB attorney, serving as assistant general counsel the last three years.

Peterson was considered by President Truman for a post on the five-man board in 1949 but the appointment went to Paul Styles of Alabama, the candidate of one of the President's strongest supporters in the South, Sen. Lister Hill (D-Ala.).

The present vacancy is for the unexpired term ending in 1956 of James J. Reynolds Jr., who resigned effective Jan. 1. A regular term is five years.

A native of Finland, Peterson grew up in Kettle Falls, Wash., was graduated from Washington State College in 1933 and the Duke University law school in 1936. He is 40 years old and married.

Peterson and Morse first teamed up in 1937 when Morse took leave as dean of the University of Oregon Law School to head the U. S. Attorney General's survey of prison release procedures, a study of state and federal laws pertaining to pardons, probations, paroles and prison administration.

The following year Morse returned to Eugene and Peterson joined the staff of the National Labor Relations Board. Morse returned to Eugene and Peterson chairman of President Roosevelt's railway emergency board, and a year later he was appointed the public member of the National War Labor Board, not to be confused with the NLRB.

Supreme Court Hears Appeal in Mrs. Hansen Case

The Oregon Supreme Court heard arguments Wednesday in the appeal of Mrs. Sigurd Hansen, Corvallis, from a conviction for first degree murder.

She was sentenced to life in the state penitentiary for the murder of her husband. She was accused of crushing him to death with their automobile in the family garage.

Her attorneys contend it was accidental, and that there was no evidence to justify the conviction. The high court also heard an appeal in the Portland General Electric Company's suit to prevent the city of Estacada from annexing territory which includes company property.

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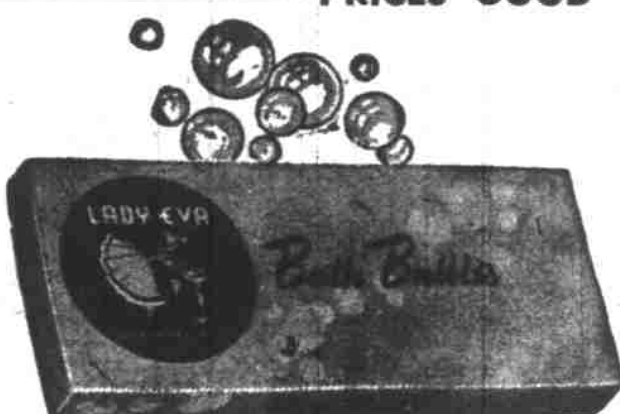
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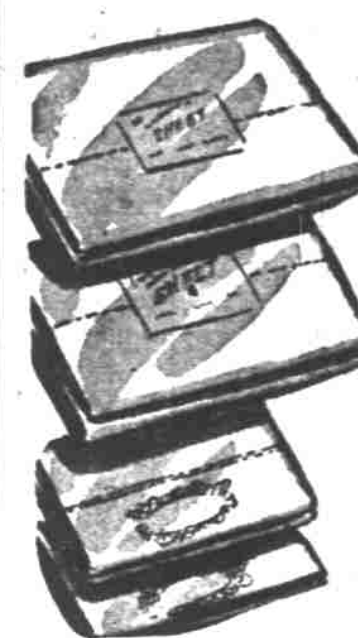
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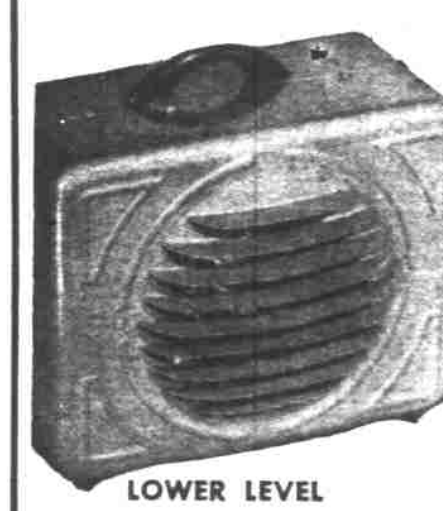
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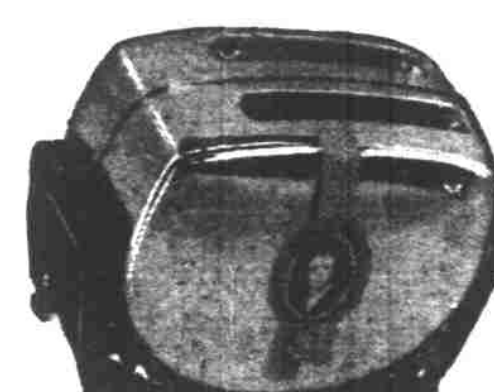
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
