Deed to Salem's IOOF Cemetery Goes to County

Deed to Salem's IOOF Cemetery was presented Wednesday to Marion County Court, under authority of a 1951 legislative act, and the court took under advisement the acceptance of the property.

A quit claim deed was turned over by Chemeketa Lodge 1, IOOF, which in 1855 established the cemetery, where many Salem pioneers are buried.

Insufficient maintenance of the cemetery led to considerable work several months ago by Pioneer Cemetery Association and to passage of the law providing that the County Court could take it over for operation and maintenance. Only the one cemetery was involved in the law.

The county budgeted \$1,000 for the current year for maintenance but has not decided whether it will accept ownership, said County Judge Rex Hartley.

The property now includes 30 acres adjacent to South Commercial Street. The trustees for the lodge, including Leston W. Howell, Raymond Webb and W. H. Garner who presented the deed yesterday, said about \$3,500 is held in trust at a Salem bank, with interest to be used in maintaining designated plots. They said the interest is now inadequate to provide proper care, but that the fund would be turned over to the county if it is legally possible.

Salem Area Students On Barometer Staff

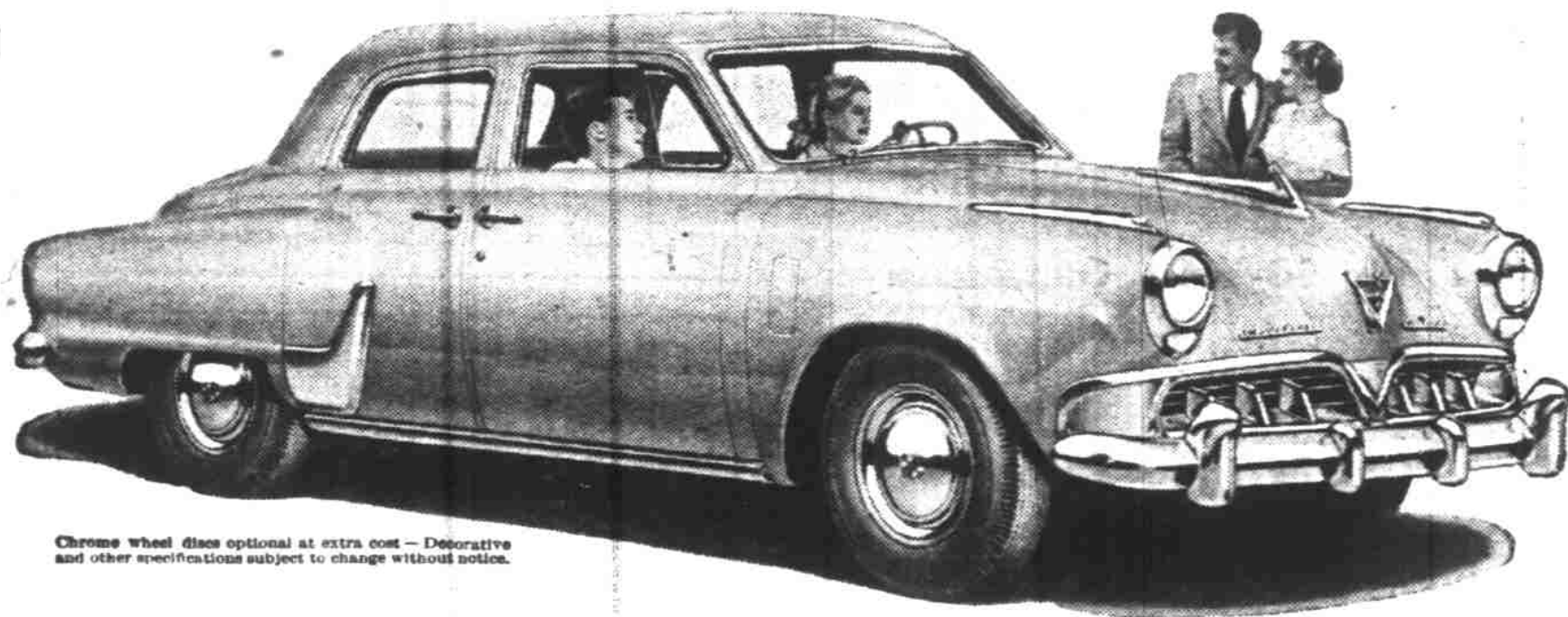
