

Three featured players of the new movie, "Bend of the River," will make a personal appearance in Salem Tuesday.

They are Julia Adams, feminine lead of the action film with an Oregon trail historical background; Rock Hudson and Lori Nelson.

The acting trio will meet with Salem theatermen and the press in the afternoon, then appear on stages of the Elsinore and Capitol Theaters in the evening at approximately 7 o'clock.

"Bend of the River" was filmed at Mt. Hood and was directed by James Stewart, who also stars in the picture. The movie will be premiered in Portland Jan. 23 and in Salem Jan. 24.
