'Kidnap' Story Invented by Salem Woman

A young Salem married woman's story of five hours forced ride in a strange man's auto, told to city police Saturday morning, was later found to be a hoax on her own admission under questioning by detectives.

Police said investigation of the 21-year-old woman's story turned up questionable factors and evidence indicating she had stayed all night with a girl friend. When confronted with the evidence, she admitted the story was false, police said.

The woman previously had given a page-long signed statement to police, telling them she was dragged into an auto at South High and Mission Streets and forced to ride devious routes through the city by an "ignorant man" who "sang and drank constantly." He drove far out the Salem-Dallas Highway and back into the Liberty district, in the Turner area and finally to a side road near the Penitentiary Annex, she said in the statement.

She said she leaped from the car at that point and hid in the bushes while he searched for her. After he left, she said she walked to Salem and called her mother from a grocery store.

Police were called in and the woman later admitted she had torn her own clothing and smeared dirt on her face after her night-long stay away from home. Police said the escapade followed an argument with her husband.

She was reported missing early Saturday morning by her husband.
