

## U.S. Prepares Atomic Control Plans for U.N.

PARIS (AP)—The United States announced Wednesday it will present important new proposals on control of atomic energy to the newly created U. N. Disarmament Commission when the commission begins work in New York in a few weeks.

U. S. Ambassador Ernest A. Gross told the 60-nation political committee his delegation could not decide whether revised proposals for atomic energy put up by Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky last Saturday represented "a step backward or a step forward."

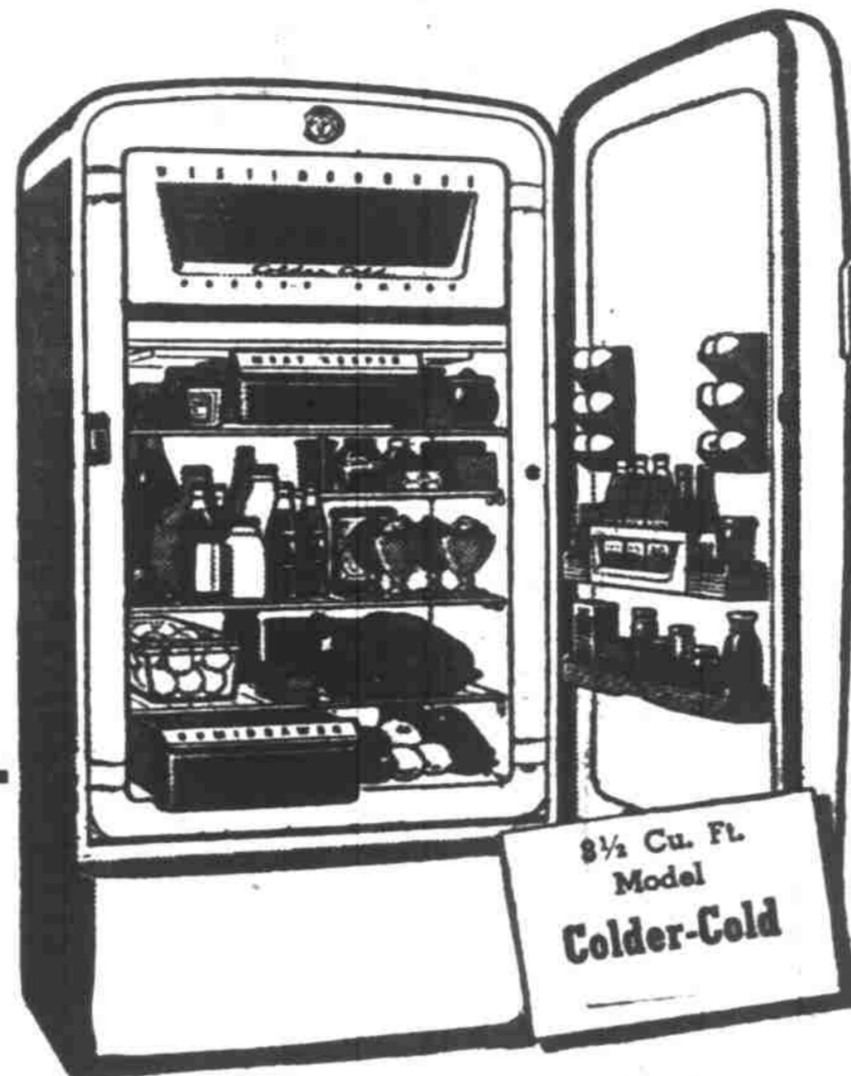

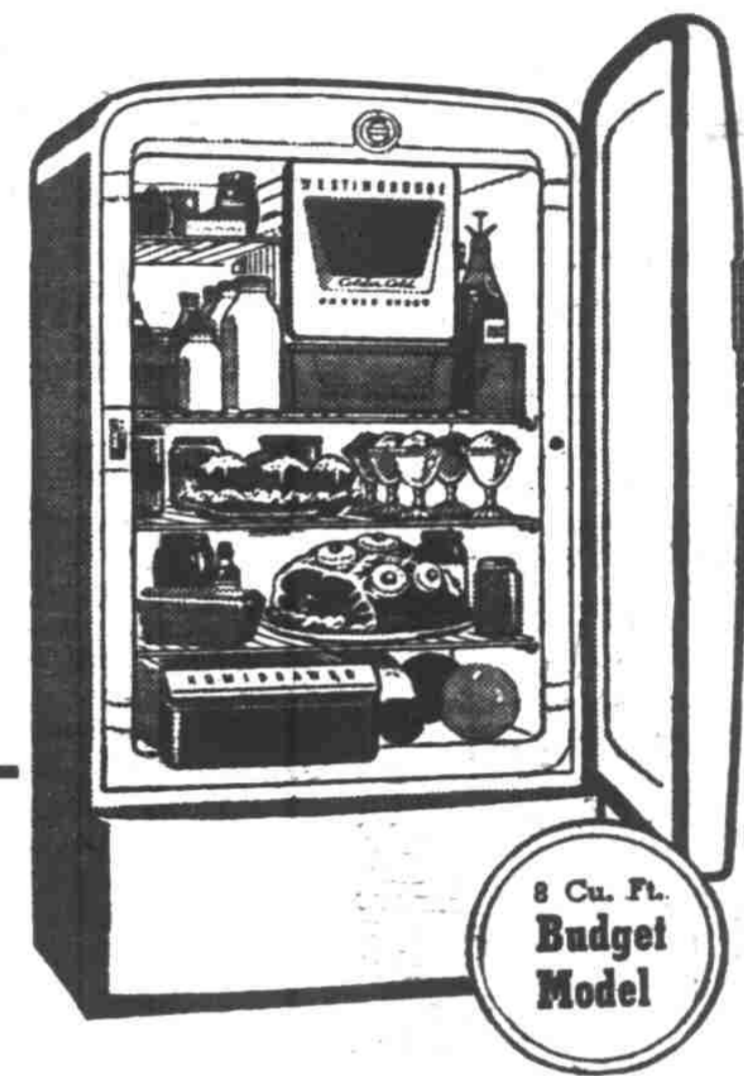
