Q. When calling on a friend who is ill and one is not permitted to see him, is it proper to write a short message on one's card?

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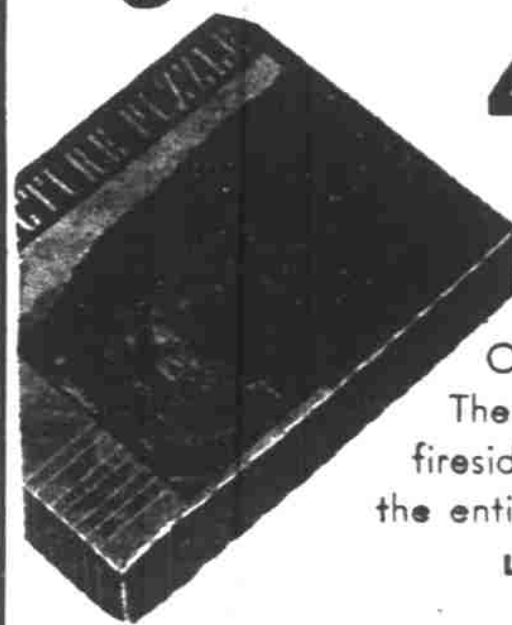


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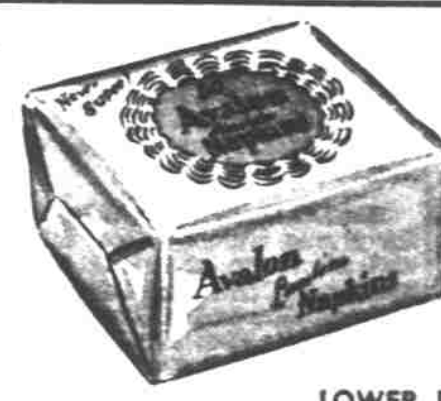
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
