Opinions Clash Over Fate Of Woodburn Park Trees; Public Hearing Thursday

WOODBURN — The State of Oregon is said to have more standing timber than any other state in the nation.

But at the present time a small grove of trees in Woodburn is the center of more talk and arguments locally than all the rest, as Woodburn people continue to discuss the proposed sale of the timber at Legion Park.

The matter will be brought before the public this week as the Woodburn park and recreation board will hold an open meeting at City Hall Thursday evening, Jan. 24, at 8 o'clock.

Harold M. Austin, chairman of the board, has invited all organizations and persons desiring to express an opinion on the matter to attend.

The Park Board has been asked by the City Council to make a recommendation on whether to cut or not to cut the estimated 283,000 feet of timber the park is said to contain. The City Council will have final decision on the subject.

A delegation from the Woodburn fire department appeared before the council at its last meeting and requested that the trees be left standing unless an impartial timber cruiser finds that they are "ripe" or in danger of falling.

In that case the firemen requested the money realized from the sale of the trees be used to install lights at the Legion Park baseball field and also to clear and reforest the area from which the timber is taken. Firemen are expected to attempt to put this idea across at Thursday's meeting.

It is rumored that the local American Legion post will send a delegation to the meeting with the same program outlined.
