German Dialect Play Attracts Laughs, Applause at College

By DARREL DE CHABY Statesman Campus Correspondent "Papa Is All," a comedy in three acts by Patterson Greene, provided a laugh a minute for an audience which filled Waller Hall on the university campus last evening for the first of three performances.

The action of the play takes place in a Mennonite household and is done in a German dialect. Briefly it is the story of Jake Aukamp, who invents things; and is "queer in the head," and his sister Emma, who is in love with a surfer, and their attempt to break away from the control of their domineering Papa who frowns upon such "devil's inventions" as movies and telephones.

They are helped in their struggle by Mama Aukamp who married Papa when she was "thirty and couldn't be choosy". Mrs. Yoder, a busybody to end all busybodies, and Brendie, a policeman with a heart.

Papa, who hulked about the stage bellowing, frowning or brandishing a bullwhip, was admirably played by Jim Hitchman. Hitchman gave the play its most dramatic moments with his harsh guttural voice. No less effective were Ann Ellsperman as Mama and Sue Mellor as Mrs. Yoder. Miss Ellsperman gave Mama a quiet strength with just enough sparkle in her characterization, and her work with the dialect was particularly amusing. Miss Mellor with her fluttering hands, rolling eyes and ridiculous hats was the prototype of a busybody as Mrs. Yoder.

Patsy Older played daughter Emma with love in her eyes and hate in her heart in another fine portrayal. Dick Geer, as the terror-stricken son who finally turned the tables on Papa, made good use of his fine voice and sensitive face. Eric Ohlund as Brendie, the policeman, gave a very smooth and effective performance.

"Papa Is All" is the second of three major productions scheduled by the drama department this year, and is staged and directed by Dean Graunke of the Willamette drama department.

Marie Corner, who will play Mrs. Yoder in tonight's performance, is production manager for the play, which will be presented again tomorrow evening in Waller Hall with curtain time at 8:15. Coffee is served during intermission by the drama department.

Grandma Not As Needed as She Once Was

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The sad plight of the modern-day grandmother was outlined Sunday by a University of Chicago sociologist for 200 specialists in obstetrics and gynecologists.

"She finds there is little housework these days and there is no one to need her," explained Dr. Evelyn Millis Duvall, secretary of the National Council of Family Relations, in an address to the Los Angeles Obstetrical and Gynecological Society.

"Her husband is at the peak of his productive period, and that keeps him busy. She finds herself lost. Often it's the doctor who must reorient her and point out new activities."

Young newlyweds also find the going tougher now than did those of 50 years ago, Dr. Duvall said. Grandpa was about 26 and had been making his own living for 14 years when he assumed the responsibilities of matrimony.

Today's bridegroom averages about 22, and probably is still going to school, she added. Chances are his bride is more realistic than he is.

The Draft Board thought his answer meant he was separated from his wife. So they drafted him.

Timmons said "by the time I figured out what had happened, I was in the Army and on the way to Korea."

He spent enough time fighting to collect a Purple Heart, Unit Citation, a Korea Citation and his corporal's stripes.

Timmons will be discharged Sept. 24.
