

Stassen, Mac, Ke Entered in Pennsylvania

The names of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, Harold E. Stassen and Gen. Douglas MacArthur were entered in Pennsylvania's presidential preferential primary just before the lists closed Monday.

Unless any of the men withdraw in writing before Feb. 25, their names will be on the Republican ballot for the voting April 22.

There were no candidates entered for the Democratic Presidential primary.

In Pennsylvania the signature or consent of a candidate is not required to put him in the preferential contest.

Sen. Taft of Ohio, an active campaigner for the GOP Presidential nomination, said in Washington he saw no reason for entering the Pennsylvania primary, since the state's 10 at-large delegates to the Republican convention already have been chosen and the vote is not binding on them. Some district candidates for delegates probably will be entered for him, Taft added.

Pennsylvania will send 70 delegates to each of the two major party conventions in Chicago next July.
