

McCarthy Links Morris To 'Front' Participants

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) charged Tuesday that two trustees of a rich foundation headed by Newbold Morris, federal anti-corruption chief, have records as participants in many "communist front" activities. He did not name the trustees, but on the basis of information he furnished a Senate investigations subcommittee arrangements were made to subpoena them for questioning.

Two Paroles Revoked in Circuit Court

Probation was revoked Thursday in Marion County Circuit Court for two men convicted of passing worthless checks.

Kenneth A. Vogt, sentenced last Nov. 9, was returned to the county jail to complete a six-month sentence. A. E. Moreland was sent to the State Penitentiary to serve an 18-month sentence imposed last May 2.

James M. Taylor, Salem Route 2, Box 188, waived indictment and pleaded guilty to obtaining property by false pretenses, involving passing worthless checks for merchandise in Salem. He is to be sentenced March 17.

Lake County Now Has New Draft Board

LAKEVIEW, Ore. (AP)—Lake County got a new draft board Thursday, even while the fuss continued over two Irishmen who refused to be drafted.

That refusal led the old draft board to resign in protest.

The Irishmen, Jeremiah Moynihan and John O'Keefe, presented certificates to show that under a U. S. treaty of friendship they, as aliens, do not have to serve in the armed forces.

The two are in this country on permanent visas, sponsored by Walter Lehmann, a sheep rancher.

The new draft board was organized and will be functioning as soon as a presidential commission arrives, probably by April 1.

Moynihan said as an alien he would not be entitled to veteran or disability benefits. Langdon said that was not true.

Moynihan said his dependents could get no allotments. Langdon also said that was not true. Both Moynihan and O'Keefe are single.

Moynihan also complained that he had no chance as an alien to become an officer and there was no easy route to citizenship, as there was for aliens who served in World War II.

Death Claims Philip Bowman

Bowman, a Spanish-American war veteran, was born Dec. 3, 1877 in Greenbush, Ill., and came to Oregon from Galesburg, Ill., in 1902. He has lived in Silverton and Junction City and Salem for the past five years.

He had been maintenance engineer at the State Tuberculosis Hospital and was a member of the Christian Church.

Bowman is survived by his wife, Allie, of Salem; a daughter, Mrs. M. L. Bowman, Salem, and a granddaughter, Florence Mae Ingram of Salem.

Services are scheduled for Monday at 1:30 p.m. under the direction of Clough-Barrick Chapel.

FCC Will Study Contention That Stations Overlap

The Federal Communications Commission has ruled that there shall be a hearing before action is taken on an application for a third radio station in Salem.

This was the word received Thursday from Washington attorneys by Glenn McCormick, president of Oregon Radio, Inc. The hearing would determine whether the application involved an overlapping coverage. A decision might take several months, attorneys indicated.

Wednesday, the Associated Press reported the FCC had turned down the protests of KSLM and KOCO, Salem radio stations, that (1) proposed station KGAE would overlap in coverage with Station KGAL of Lebanon, and therefore that (2) since KGAE and KGAL represented the same ownership the application of KGAE to operate in Salem should be disallowed.

But the FCC then apparently took the same contention under advisement itself.

Loco Ace Adds No. 8 in North Korean Action

SEOUL (AP)—The "Loco Ace" of the Fifth Air Force, Capt. Charles F. Wolfe, knocked out his eighth Communist locomotive Thursday night with a bull's-eye.

The B-26 light bomber pilot from Chula Vista, Calif., caught a freight train moving south of Pyongyang, the North Korean capital. Lt. John King, Graniteville, Mass., with Wolfe on the flight, told what happened.

"We damaged it on the first pass," he said, "but the locomotive kept on going. Then we circled and hit it again. Chuck put the second bomb right on top of the cab of the locomotive. Suddenly the boxcars were without a locomotive. Then we strafed the cars."

Wolfe later scored a hit on a second train, forcing it to stop, and Lt. Donald C. Jordan of Dublin, Ga., wrecked it with three bomb hits.

Wolfe got the title of "Loco Ace" after he destroyed five enemy locomotives. Fighter pilots become aces when they down five planes.
