Forest Reserve Rental Receipts Given to Counties

Distribution of \$4,292,056.59, representing 25 per cent of receipts from forest reserve rentals, was announced by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry here on Wednesday.

The distribution involves receipts for the year ended June 30, 1951, and is the largest in the state's history.

Seventy-five per cent of the state's share goes to the county road funds and 25 per cent to the county school funds.

Distribution to the counties includes: Linn, \$274,536; Marion, \$111,694; Polk, \$853; and Yamhill, \$5369.

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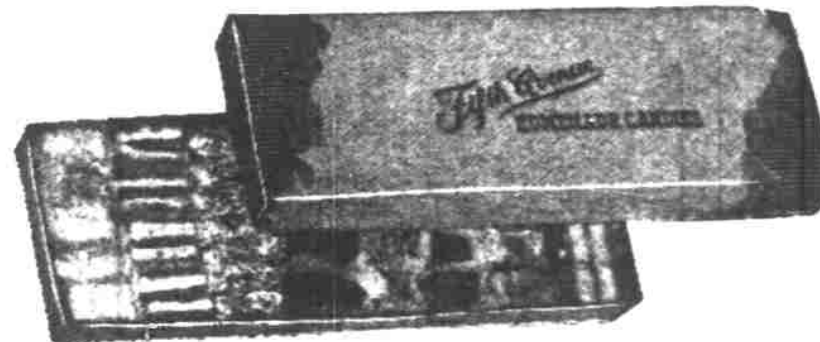
