

### Abbey Church Dedication Slated Friday

MT. ANGEL—The newly completed Mt. Angel Abbey Church, a \$300,000 reinforced concrete building with buff brick and terra-cotta facing, will be dedicated on the feast of St. Benedict, Friday, March 21.

Many bishops, abbots and clergy have been invited for the festive occasion to mark another milestone in the work of the Benedictines at Mt. Angel. They founded and named the town in the early '90s and have survived two disastrous fires.

The new church is in Romanesque style. A rose window rises above the porch or atrium, its full beauty seen only from within the church.

The Most Rev. Archbishop Edward D. Howard of Portland will officiate at the solemn blessing ceremony at 10 a. m. The Rt. Rev. Abbot Thomas Meier, OSB, of Mt. Angel will offer the solemn pontifical mass.

In the traditional observance of the feast of St. Benedict as Clergy Day at Mt. Angel abbey, dinner will be served to the visiting prelates and clergy at noon.

Open house for laymen will be held on the first Sunday of May, highlighted by dedication of the basement church as St. Joseph's Shrine, to be used as a seminary chapel and for retreat exercises.

### 1st Methodist Plans Crusade For Building

First Methodist congregation will note the anniversary of its Salem church Sunday, just prior to launching a \$130,000 crusade for remodeling the 80-year-old structure. It was built in the 1870s and dedicated March 17, 1878.

The fund campaign will be from March 23 to April 6, under direction of Dr. John Henry Soltman, director of the Methodist board of missions and church extension.

Local arrangements are in charge of a committee headed by Dr. Frank B. Bennett and including Dr. Brooks H. Moore, pastor, Dr. Waldo Zeller, Lloyd A. Lee, C. Ronald Hudkins, Walter Minier and Dr. Robert F. Anderson.

Already completed is most of the exterior remodeling, including considerable rebuilding of the spire and cleaning of the brick walls. Remodeling and redecoration of the sanctuary and other portions will follow.

Just returned from a trip to observe Presbyterian missions in Guatemala, Poling has been active in foreign mission work since his election as president of the World Christian Endeavor Union in 1925.

He also is editor of Christian Herald magazine and has started his duties as chaplain of the Chapel of the Four Chaplains in Philadelphia. This portion of the Baptist Church with an altar for Catholic, Jewish and Protestant faiths, is a memorial to chaplains who gave their lives to soldiers and died in the World War II sinking of the USS Dorchester. One of the chaplains was Daniel Poling's son, Clark.

### Legion to Stress 'Teach Children Religion' Program

The American Legion in Oregon has designated March and April as "Teach Children Religion" months and is sponsoring an active program in each Legion post.

Department Chaplain P. M. Blenkinsop described the purpose of this program as being to awaken all citizens, regardless of their station in life, and without relation to their religious affiliations, to the need for "moral and spiritual consciousness on the part of our children, who are the citizens of tomorrow and who will either fill important positions of leadership in the church, home, business and government or else fall by the wayside; based upon the opportunities we afford them to understand their spiritual and moral responsibilities."

Post 9 Commander Conrad Paulson emphasized that all individual citizens and organizations were invited to participate.

This is the third year that this program has been actively sponsored by the department of Oregon.

### Sharing Hour On March 23 To Aid World

NEW YORK—"One Great Hour of Sharing," the 1952 united appeal of 21 Protestant denominations for world relief, will climax the coming week. Offerings of food, clothing, medicines and money will be brought to churches on Sunday, March 23.

The appeal will be made in churches over the nation, under sponsorship of the Department of Church World Service, National Council of Churches of Christ.

More than \$6,000,000 in material relief is expected from the offerings. Most will be used for work in Korea, India, the Near East and Central Europe, where an estimated 30,000,000 people are in dire distress.

### Early Church Story Slated

The story of the early Christian church will be graphically told and pictured Sunday evening at Englewood Evangelical United Brethren Church.

Featured will be the mass persecution of the early church under the Roman emperors and the legalizing of the Christian religion by Constantine. Also the beginning of Papal rule will be explained and its gradual control over Christianity will be traced to the Reformation period.

Projected pictures on phases of the early church heroism will be shown, and colored maps will be used to locate major events.

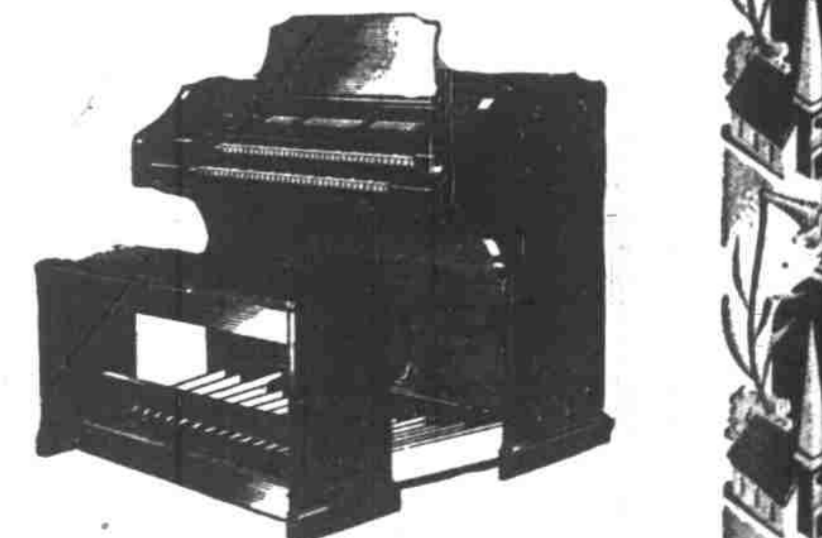
