500 Children Study English

SAIGON, Indo-China (AP)—About 500 Vietnamese youngsters are enrolled to learn English "with an American accent"—and it's all free. Attaches of the American legation and the wives of American officials in Saigon have volunteered to act as teachers. About 20 of them teach English to the Vietnamese children at regular periods for one hour each week.

Broadcasting Critic Fired

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaya (AP)—The bearded broadcaster who has been described as the government's "official gadfly" is about to lose his job as chief news editor of the government-controlled Radio-Malaya. He is Alex Josey, who was barred from the air several months ago because some of the members of the Federal Legislative Council didn't like his socialist views on nationalizing rubber and stinging criticism of government mistakes. Acting Chief Secretary D. C. Watherston announced in the legislative council recently that Josey's government contract would not be renewed.

Weary Artists Find Haven

MILAN, Italy, (AP)—An international "house of rest" for aging artists and writers will be built here by "Angelicum", a cultural organization sponsored by the Franciscan Friars. A spokesman for Angelicum said the house would offer bed and meals for visiting foreign writers. Its permanent guests would be "those who in the decline of their creativeness may need care and assistance." Funds for the house of rest will be collected through art shows, writings and collections in Italy and abroad. Organizers here said groups in the United States, Brazil, Sweden, France and Switzerland are co-operating.

SCIENTISTS PROBE MOUNDS

DUBLIN (AP)—Irish archeologists are to probe the secrets of mounds at Tara in County Meath, which was once the royal capital where the kings of Ireland reigned from before the time of Christ. Excavations will start at the site known as the rath (fortified earthwork) of the synods, close to the rath of kings, where the first early Christian synods are said to have been held by St. Patrick more than 1,500 years ago.

Blood Money Will Settle Fatal Feud

CAIRO, (AP)—The ancient method of settling disputes by "blood-money" agreements has been invoked to end a fatal feud between two tribes in the Aqaba protectorate, the Arab News Agency has reported. Feuding between the Awdalies and Beidhanies tribes had brought death to about 50 men on both sides. Under the agreement reached, each tribe will submit a list of names of men killed. Each dead Awdali will be written off against a dead Beidhani. The tribe that comes out with the least men killed will pay the blood-money to the relatives of the dead men of the tribe having the most men killed.

Lots of Jobs In Australia

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP)—Vacant jobs in Australia are plenty today, but there is still plenty of unemployment. Secretary H. A. Bland, of the Labor and National Service Department, said the number of vacant jobs in this Dominion fell from 140,000 to 100,000 between August, 1951, and last month. Bland told newsmen the demand for workers in many industries is still in excess of supply. However, there has been a falling off of employment in the clothing, footwear, textile and radio industries, he said.
