Whole blood has been available to everyone without charge since the bank program was initiated three years ago, but no regular supply of the blood plasma has been available because of armed forces demands.

Whole blood is usable over a 21-day period and if not used in that time is processed into plas-ma. The irratiated plasma and another derivative, serum albumen, have been used in quantity by the armed forces, because they have an indefinite keeping quality. Two pints of blood are required for a single unit of plasma and five pints of blood are required for a single unit of serum albumen.

A small reserve of plasma has been available for the last year at population centers where there are no facilities for keeping the whole blood, Mill City, Stayton and Woodburn. While whole blood will be used whenever possible at The plasma, as is the blood, will serum albumen, costly to produce,




