## Salem Bank Deposits Top Previous Year

Deposits are running well above last year at two Salem banks that reported quarterly statements of condition Monday.

Loans are up, too, in figures released by the Willamette Valley Bank and the Salem branch of the First National Bank of Portland.

The latter reported deposits of \$24,474,427 and loans of \$9,575,531 as of March 31. Comparable figures for one year previous were listed at \$18,271,204 and \$8,374,827.

The Willamette Valley Bank, reporting approximate figures for the same date, announced deposits of \$3,323,000 and loans of \$1,400,000. Comparable figures for the end of the first quarter of 1951 were placed at \$2,410,000 and \$1,150,000.

A spokesman for Ladd and Bush branch, U. S. National Bank of Portland, said that institution does not release condition statements on a quarterly basis.
