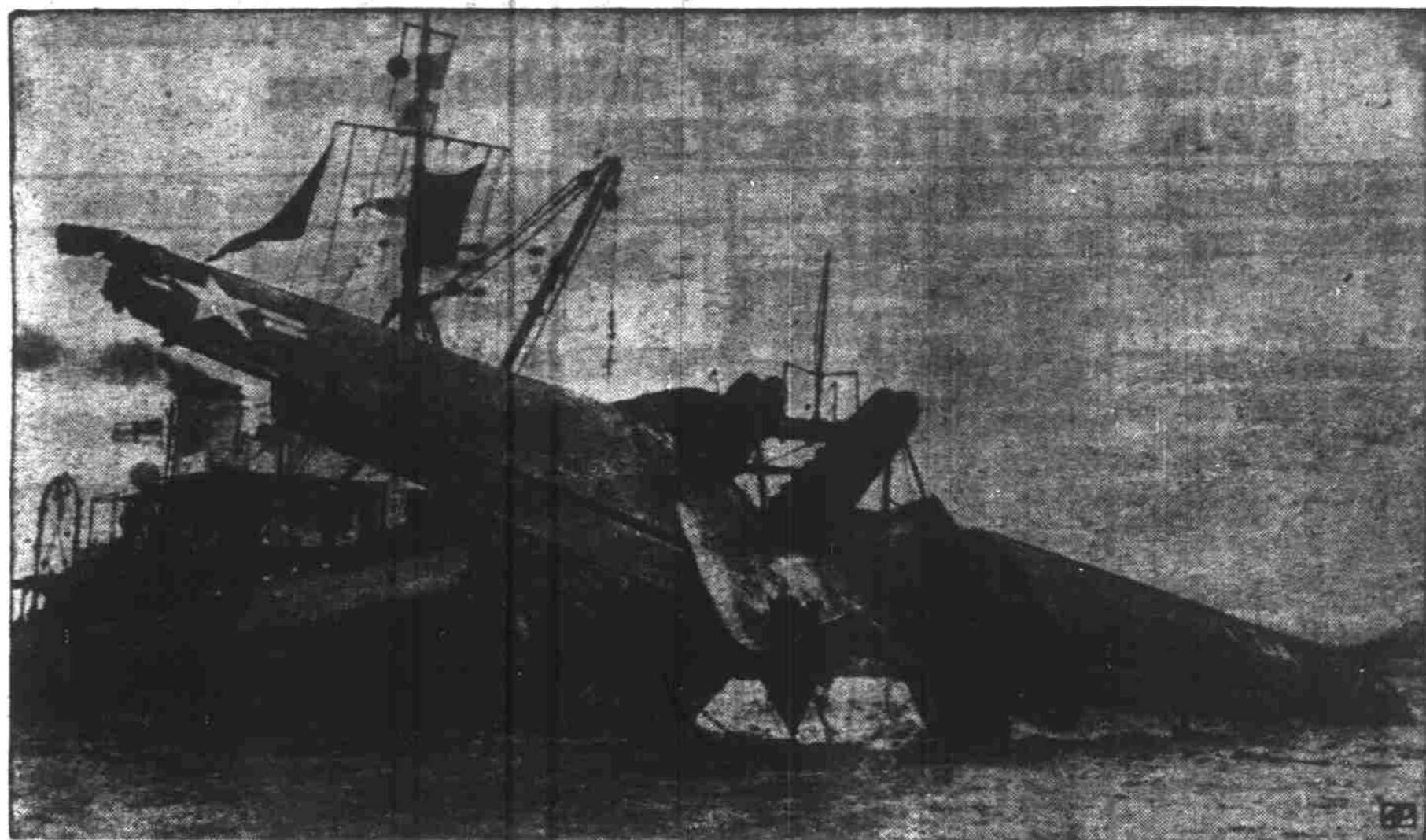
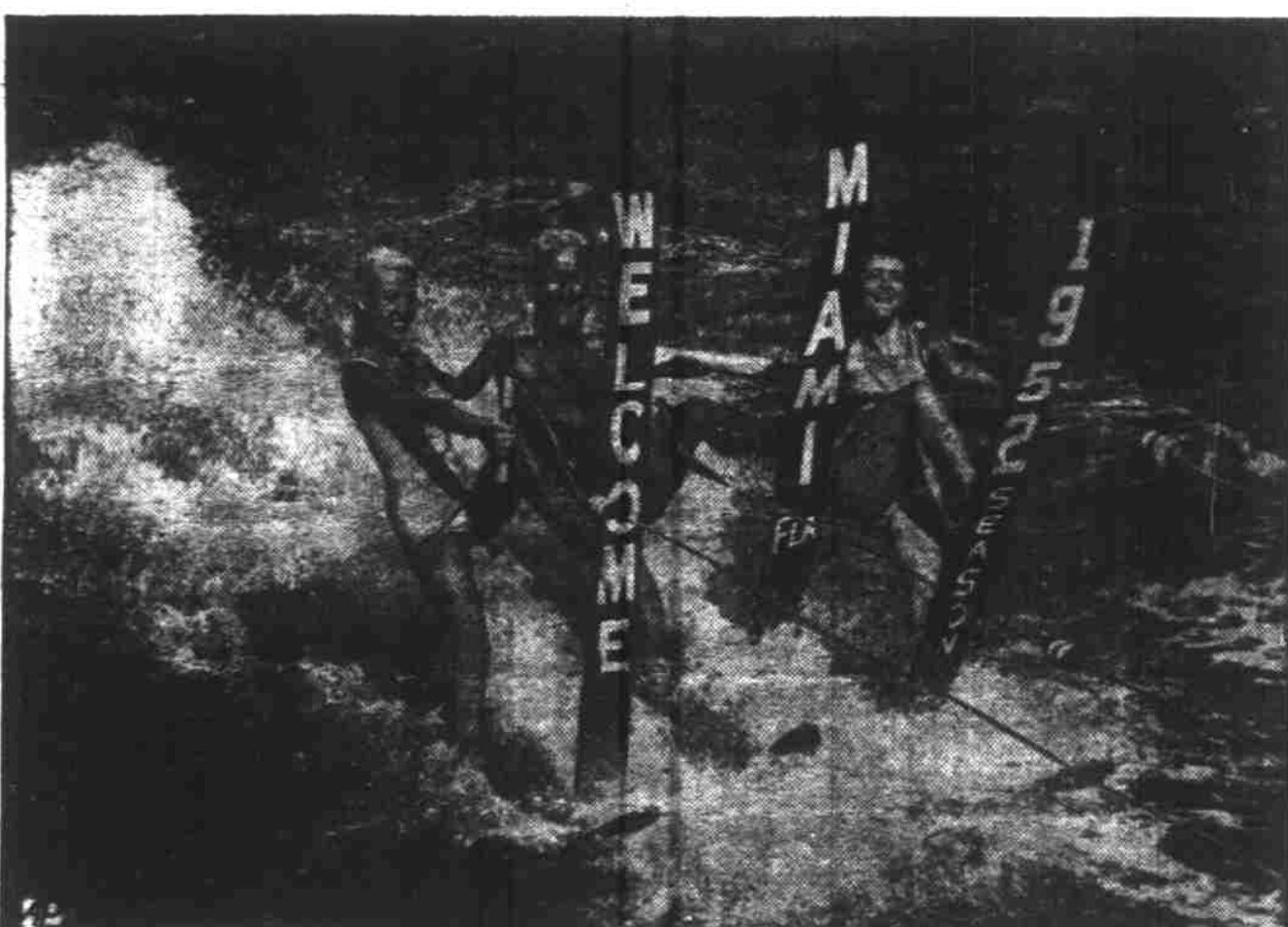

Bend Firm Low Bidder For Timber Road Job
PORTLAND (AP)—J. W. Briggs, Bend, is the low bidder for construction of the first of several timber access roads planned by the Bureau of Land Management. He bid \$685,349 to build a 11½-mile road along Quartzville Creek in Linn County. There were six other bidders. Stumpage sold by the Bureau of Land Management will include a charge for use of the road. It will be available also to other loggers as a toll road.

Most Grain Prices Rise

CHICAGO (AP)—Most grain prices rose while new crop wheat sank to new seasonal lows on the board of trade Saturday.

The selling in new crop wheat stemmed mainly from last Thursday's Agriculture Department crop report, forecasting a bumper winter wheat yield of 946,845,000 bushels. That would compare with only 645,469,000 bushels harvested last year, a poor crop year.

Other cereals were not influenced by the action of new crop wheat. Corn rose on the Agriculture Department's report that stocks on farms were quite a bit smaller than a year ago, and widespread rains in the Mid-West sent buying into oats. The rains will delay seeding.

Wheat closed ¼ lower to ¾ higher, corn ¼-¾ higher, oats ¾ higher, rye 1½ to 2 cents higher, soybeans ¼-¾ higher and fed 2 cents lower to 2 cents a hundred pounds lower.

The May wheat contract—representing the old crop—moved upward. Trade circles reported Japan bought nearly seven million bushels of Pacific Coast wheat Friday.

For the week wheat ended ¼ lower to 1½ higher, corn 2¼-2½ higher, oats ¼-¾ higher, rye 3½ to 5 cents higher, soybeans ¾ to 2 cents higher and fed 15 to 15 cents a hundred pounds higher.

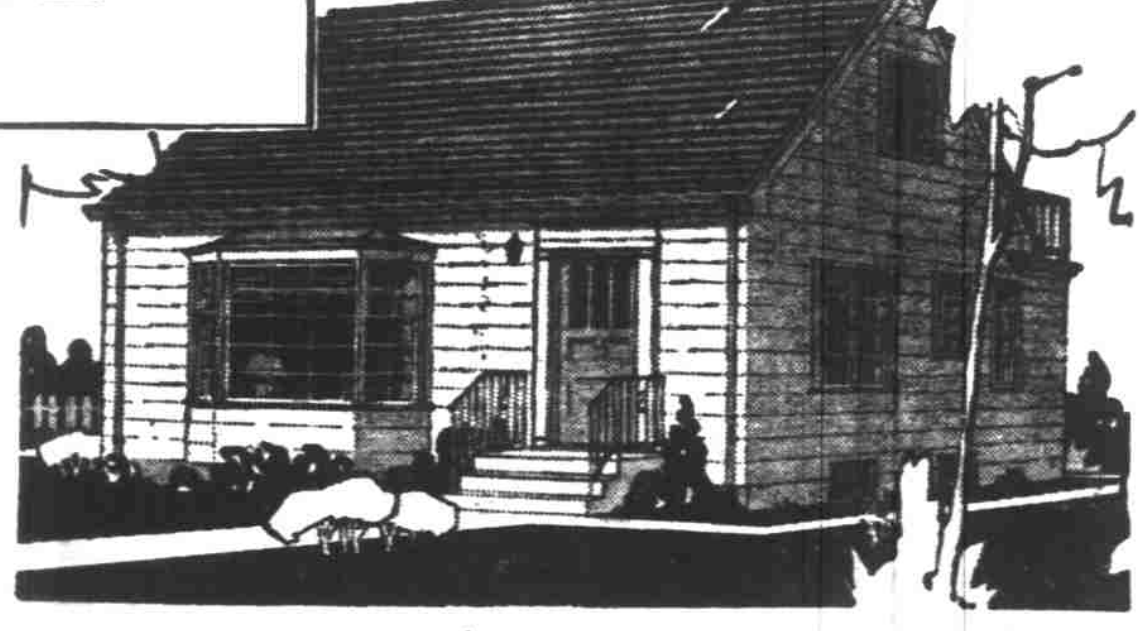
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
