New Hospital Wing Near at Silverton

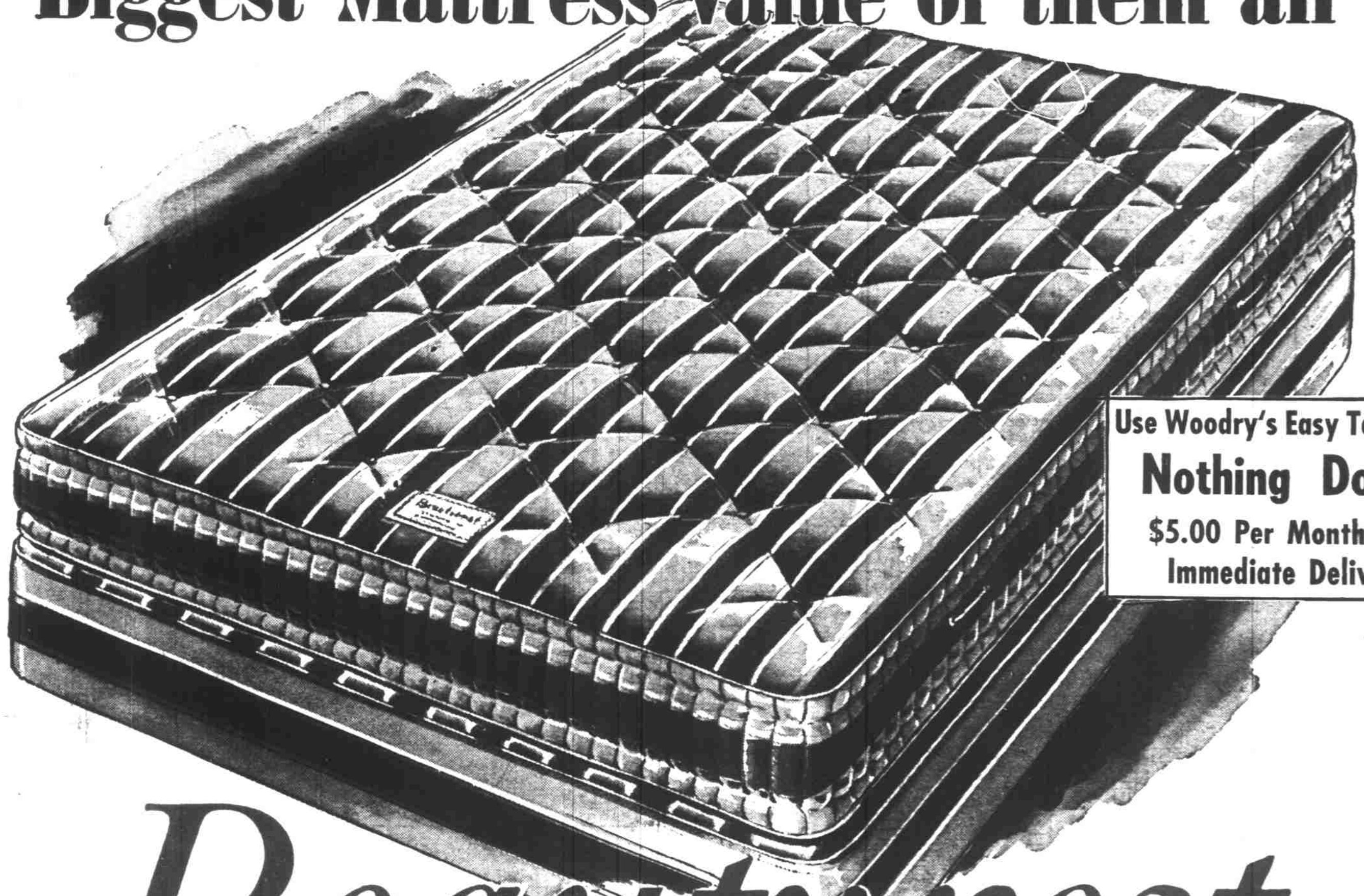

Sponsors of "get out the vote" are the Rotary, Exchange and Lions and East Albany Lions Clubs, with the Junior Women's Club manning the booths.

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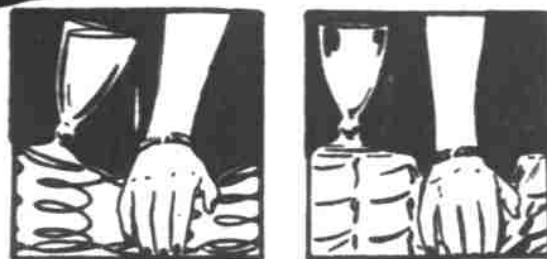
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
