## Woman Returned To Penitentiary as Parole Violator

Jean L. Cook Saturday was taken to the Oregon State Penitentiary where she will serve a three-year term for forgery. She pleaded guilty to the charge last May 20 and was put on five years probation.

Her probation was revoked Saturday after she allegedly violated its terms.

She was arraigned May 20, 1950, and pleaded guilty at that time to the charge of forgery. She was sentenced May 26 to serve an indeterminate sentence, not to exceed three years, in the Oregon State Penitentiary. This sentence was subsequently changed and she was placed on five years probation.
