FAMILY DINNERS ON CALENDAR FOR TODAY

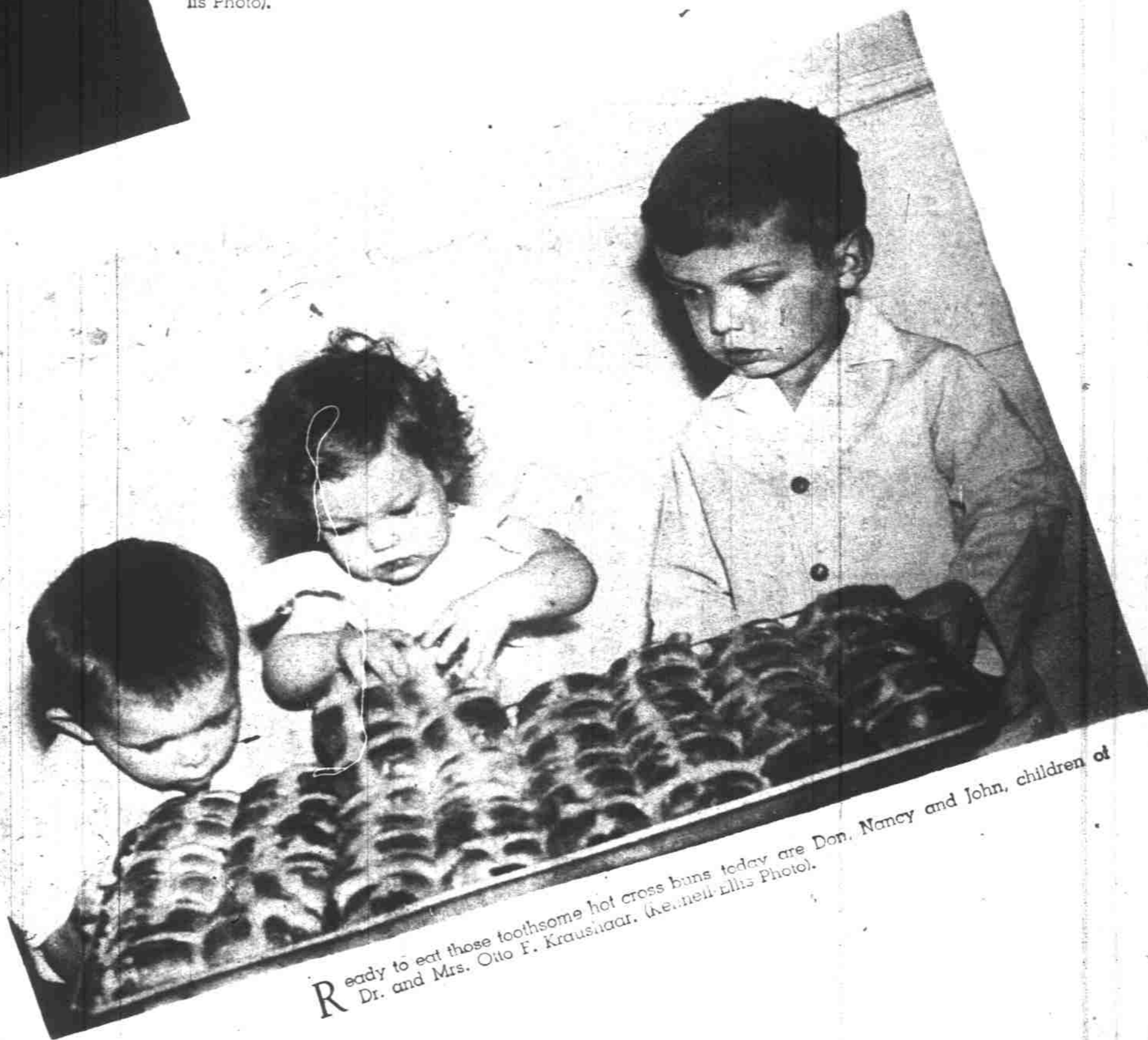
