Candidates to Speak Monday

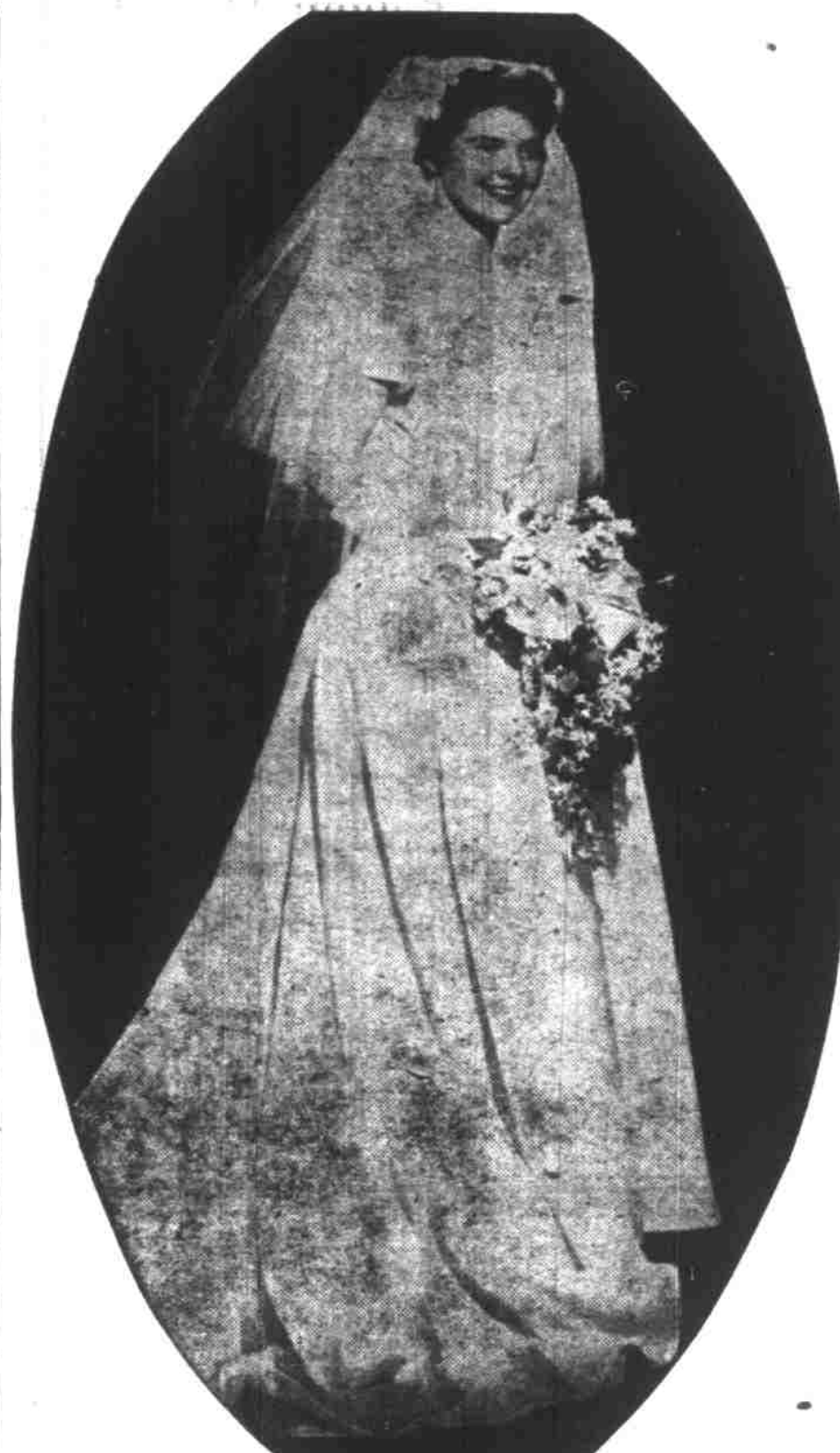

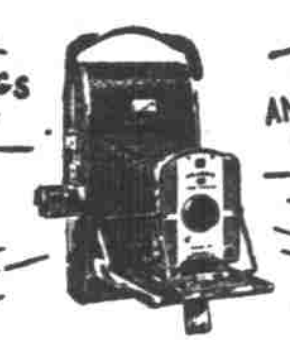
