# Adventists Send 211 to Missions, Half of Budget

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The Seventy-day Adventist Church sent 211 new missionary appointees to overseas stations during 1951, according to a report by church headquarters here.

Of these, 143 were from America, and the remainder from Australia, Europe and other overseas divisions. In addition 144 Adventist missionaries who had been on furlough returned to their mission stations.

Since 1902 the denomination has sent out and supported 6,848 foreign missionaries. The first overseas missionary sailed in 1874.

Of the 1952 budget of \$17,060,650 the church has designated \$9,303,650 for overseas work.
